

4. Cotton, Paddy, Season Crops, Contract Farming, Groundnut etc.









Talk

4. Topography dictates the spread of resources



Findings


1. Fields closer to water source – Cotton

Poverty Eradication – Self Help Groups(Goleti)

1. Total 170 Groups, 150 Active.
2. 3 Village Organizer – Clusters
3. All of 170 have bank linkage
4. Dairy, Poultry & Tailoring Businesses.
5. Taking benefit of Vaddi leni Runalu Scheme.

Kagaznagar ULB – Self Help Groups

1. Total 867 Groups,
2. All of 170 have bank linkage
3. Loan target 18 cr but achieved 20 cr
4. Variety of businesses by SHG groups like Flower, Tailoring Bamboo Product making, Medical Shop etc.

POVERTY ERADICATION

Public Distribution System

1. 1 PDS center.
2. Storage Infrastructure is poor.
3. On requirement – demand generated to District



Water Supply



MISSION BHAGIRATHA WATER TANK

1. There are 11 Overhead Water Tank Capacity ranges from 40KL to 80KL
2. Quality of water was poor.
3. Water supply was not sufficient to meet demand
4. Dependency on Borewells.

Village Infrastructure



Drying Platforms

1. Under the Palle Pragathi program.
2. It is located near the agricultural fields.
3. It is used for drying crops such as cotton, paddy, Groundnut etc.



ROADS & STREET LIGHTS

1. Cement Concrete road network in most part of the village
2. Most roads have open drain channels
3. Streetlights installed
4. Village is well connected to NH nearby.



HEALTH

Anganwadi and ASHA workers

1. 4 Anganwadis located at different places
2. The Anganwadi - inside the primary school - lacked certain facilities.
3. There were 10 children, 5 pregnant women and 7 lactating women enrolled in the Anganwadi but attendance was less.
4. Frequent Vaccination Drive from AASHA workers.
5. Medicine distribution
6. Taking Pregnant womens to nearest hospital for their routine checkup and delivery.



HEALTH

PHC-Subset

1. Currently one PHC-Subset is functioning in the village.
2. ANM (**Auxiliary nurse midwife**) present
3. Common diseases – Malaria, Dengue, TB.
4. Vaccination Campaigns are being conducted by them.
5. 5-6 People visit PHC at the peak, they refer them either to nearest govt hospital at Bellampally or private medical facilities.
6. No access road to the PHC.

GOVT. Hospital Kagaznagar (ULB)

1. 30 bedded hospital with 6 doctors and 14 Nurses.
2. Approx 150 patients daily and 400 during monsoon season.



EDUCATION

Primary and Ashram Schools in Village

1. **Aashram School in goleti village** maintained by ITDA total strength was 120 while sanctioned strength was 150 with 10 teachers including headmaster.
2. There are 3 Primary Schools were there but enrolment was less.

PM-Shri and Ashram Schools in Sirpur T

1. PM-SHRI School at Sirpur Town has all streams and enough facilities.
Total strength – 979 ,Boys – 741,Girls – 235
Specially Abled – 3
2. Aashram School Sirpur T for Boys
Total strength – 180
Hostels and classes were in good condition.



VISIT TO INSTITUTIONS



1. Conducted from **morning 9 AM**
2. Visited All Institutions, interacted with various **Government Servants, Public and beneficiaries**
3. **Accompanied** by Panchayat Secretary.

Gram Panchayat

1. Located at the **center of the village**
2. Exhibits **Religious Harmony** – Temple with GP
3. Officials has **IT skills – Secretary & 1 Operator**
4. Found to be **very approachable** in paired ranking activity
5. **Infrastructure development is needed** for a large population – missing notice boards, Ladies toilets etc.
6. **Elected members are approachable to the villagers.**

Dumping yard

1. Goleti - Located outside the village.
2. Kagaznagar – Door To Door Solid Waste Collection and Disposal to landfill.
3. Solid wastes into categories such as
4. **Shoes, paper and cardboard, plastic bottles, metals and electronics, glass bottles, and other wastes.**
5. **vermicomposting** using various worms.
6. There are **two tanks in the village goleti** for operation. The tank is filled in about **3 weeks** followed by 1 month of aerobic decomposition.
7. **Payment of workers** is provided through **NREGS (MGNREGA)**





Open Gymnasium

An Open Gymnasium was constructed in **the recent past** to improve the physical fitness of villagers.



Festival Ground

A festival ground is **located near the VV Rao lake** which is hosting ground for numerous festivals like **Bathukamma**. It is also used as **feeding grounds for sheep, goat, and other cattle**



Reservoir



1. for irrigation ,washing clothes, bathing etc.


