Sec 370,IPC

- Whoever, for the purpose of exploitation, (a) recruits, (b) transports, (c) harbours, (d) transfers, or (e) receives, a person or persons, by—
 - using threats, or
 - using force, or any other form of coercion, or
 - by abduction, or
 - by practising fraud, or deception, or
 - by abuse of power, or

- by inducement, including the giving or receiving of payments or benefits, in order to achieve the consent of any person having control over the person recruited, transported, harboured, transferred or received,
commits the offence of trafficking.

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- **Explanations**

1. The expression “exploitation” shall include any act of physical exploitation or any form of sexual exploitation, slavery or practices similar to slavery, servitude, or the forced removal of organs.

2. The consent of the victim is immaterial in determination of the offence of trafficking

JOURNEY OF RECOVERY

- MIN 3 MONTHS – REVEALING REAL NAME, ACCEPTING TO BE A VICTIM, DEADDICTION, READY FOR ALTERNATIVES
- MIN 3 MONTHS- GAINING LIFESKILLS, APTITUDE ASSESSMENT, EMPLOYBILITY TRAINING
- MIN 6 MONTHS- LIVELIHOOD TRAINING, LIVELIHOOD PLACEMENTS

MINIMUM OF 1YR FOR REHABILITATION

WHAT CAN BE DONE?

- PREVENTION

- EQUIPPING THE VULNERABLE SECTIONS ON DANGERS OF TRAFFICKING

- CONVERGING SCHEMES SO THAT VULNERABILITY IS REDUCED

- IDENTIFYING POTENTIAL VICTIMS-MISSING CASES/ELOPING

- REPORTING TO LOCAL POLICE-100/ONE STOP CENTER-181/CHILDLINE1098

- SUPPORTING EFFECTIVE PROSECUTION

- ADDRESSING DEMAND-MEN, BUSINESS

- PROTECTION

- SAFE HOMES WITH MINIMUM STANDARDS OF CARE

- SUPPORTING VICTIMS IN SHELTER HOMES

- FACILITATING COMMUNITY BASED REHABILITATION

- SUPPORTING FAMILIES OF VICTIMS

- CONVERGING THE GOVERNMENT SCHEMES

NEED FROM STAKEHOLDERS?

- UNDERSTAND THE ORGANIZED CRIME
- APPLICATION OF THE LAW SO THAT VICTIM IS NOT RETRAFFICKED OR GOES BACK TO THE SAME SITUATION OF EXPLOITATION.
- NEED FOR BUSTING THE CRIMINAL SYNDICATE- IDENTIFYING THE CRIMINALS, CLOSING OF PLACES OF EXPLOITATION
- UNDERSTANDING AND APPLYING MULTIPLE VICTIM FRIENDLY WELFARE SCHEMES/POLICIES (NALSA, PARA LEGAL WORKER, PANEL LAWYER)

- NEED FOR CARE AND PROTECTION OF VICTIMS & SAFETY ASSESSMENT
- VICTIM FRIENDLY LEGAL PROCESSES
- INSISTING FOR STDS OF CARE IN HOMES.
- INTERIM COMPENSATION/INTERIM RELIEF
- ENDING DEMAND
