- Appearance of 3 water ponds in 08-2020 which were not visible earlier.














WHICH SCHEME HAS BENIFITTED YOU AND YOUR FAMILY THE MOST?



Specific Observations PHC & Asha Workers

- the doctor was missing when we visited and that too it is his duty hours
- The PHC lacked an ambulance facility too.
- Asha workers were doing their work well.
- Observed the KCR kit, found it really interesting.
- 2-3 deliveries were conducted in the previous months and the complicated ones were send to district hospitals.







Specific Observations Anganwadis

- Anganwadi center was too basic
- The kids were made to sit on the mat, instead of chairs.
- The toilet at the center was not clean.
- There was no electricity in the centre
- Campus playground was also ill maintained.







Specific Observations Community Schools

- Primary school was in the same compound
- had two classrooms for five sections.
- A single teacher was managing the classes.
- The students were aware of basic alphabets and were barely able to read their books.

Specific Observations ZP High School

- Interacted with class Vth and Xth std students
- Many of the students have expressed their desire to join the Govt service.
- Motivated the students and received feedback on how their studies are progressing.
- Observed mid-day meal food and found it was being cooked with fire wood
- Food was as per menu and quality was acceptable.
- no dedicated kitchen for cooking midday meals, it was being cooked in the verandah of an abandoned building
- Met their headmasters, teaching staff
- the school lacking tube lights, and fans in the classrooms.
- The play ground was ill maintained and toilets were un unhygienic.
- Many students were not in uniform (especially shoes)

Specific Observations Model School

- Under staffed
- No computer science as a subject in class 11th and 12th.
- Interacted with students and conducted activities
- Motivated them and answered their questions related to their future.

Specific Observations Self Help Groups

- Interacted with the SHG members, who gave us a rousing welcome,
- explained how they manage the funds, form groups and maintain their accounts.
- Many used the funds to visit set up small businesses (eg sewing, mutton shop etc)
- Highly motivated and dedicated

Specific Observations Veterinary Hospital

- Doctor and staff were present.
- It was fairly maintained.
- Shortage of medicine supply.

Specific Observations Nursery & Crematorium

Nursery:

- A nursery was constructed under the Harita haram mission
- Had saplings of Sitafal, Neem, Gulmohar, etc.

Crematorium:

- Constructed past 2 years ago.
- Well maintained and in working condition.

Scope for Improvements?

- The Doctor is a must at PHC during working hours.
- Village PHC needs an ambulance for emergency transport
- Community toilets were missing.
- Village roads needs resurfacing
- Villagers can work together to improve their standards.
- The Anganwadi, Primary and High schools need better infrastructure
- Maybe the district can provide or can rope in a Corporate to sponsor some facilities
