- 2. The revised DWP 2007 issues on 21 jun 2007.
- 3. Under E-in-C. Advises MoD and the 3 Services on peacetime and operational construction activities Design, Construction and Maintenance. Nation Building and Disaster Mitigation.
- 4. Outlay 30,000 cr.
- 5. 600 plus stations. Works are under contracts under supervision of Army and MES Engineers.






ROLE OF THE ARMED FORCES




DEFINITION

- India assumes a growing international influence and a prominent voice in global affairs.

- India has also played an important and influential role in other international organisations like <u>East Asia Summit</u>, <u>World Trade Organization</u>, <u>International Monetary Fund</u> (IMF), <u>G8+5</u>, <u>IBSA Dialogue Forum</u>, member of the <u>Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank</u>, <u>Shanghai Cooperation Organisation</u>.

INDIA – HIGHLIGHTS

- Regionally, India is a part of
 - **SAARC** and
 - **■** BIMSTEC.
 - <u>UN peacekeeping missions</u>, is the fifth-largest troop contributor.
 - Seeking a permanent seat in the <u>UN Security Council</u>, along with the other <u>G4 nations</u>.
- Initially it focused on renewing political and economic contacts with the countries of East and South-East Asia energy resources available in some of the member countries of ASEAN like Burma.
- Special emphasis on the economic development of backward NE India.

STRATEGIC PARTNERS

- The Foundation for National Security Research in New Delhi ranked India's top strategic partners with a score out of 90 points: Russia comes out on top with 62, followed by the United States (58), France (51), UK (41), Germany (37), and Japan (34).
- Countries considered India's closest include

 - RussianFederation.
 - Israel.
 - Afghanistan.
 - France.
 - Bhutan.
 - Bangladesh.
 - The United States.

STRATEGIC PARTNERS

- Russia largest supplier of military equipment to India, followed by Israel and France.
- Israel is set to overtake Russia as India's largest military the sphere of counterterrorism and space technology.
- India also enjoys strong military relations with several other countries, including the UK, the United States, Japan, Singapore, Brazil, South Africa and Italy.
- India operates an <u>airbase</u> in Tajikistan, signed a landmark defence accord with Qatar in 2008, and has leased out <u>Assumption Island</u> from <u>Seychelles</u> to build a naval base in 2015.
- Forged relationships with developing especially South Africa, Brazil, and Mexico.
- It represents the interests $\underline{G8+5}$, \underline{IBSA} and \underline{WTO} .
- Indian Look East policy greater economic and strategic partnership with Southeast Asian countries, South Korea, Japan, and Taiwan.
- Friendly relations <u>Persian Gulf countries</u> and most of the <u>African Union</u>.
