INTRODUCTION

- Situated in Miriyalguda mandal, Nalgonda district
- Established in 1555 under the name Pandinapally
- Name changed to Yadgiripally in 1634 due to the habitation and dominance of the Yadav community.
- Finally came to be known as Yadgarpally in 1834, under the rule of Nizam
- 4 people from this village went to jail in Aurangabad for standing against the Nizam government
- Got its independence from the rule of Nizam in September, 1948




