



- Easy to read, use of uncomplicated language
- Style: informal way of writing, use of Hindi and Gujarati phrases to connect the reader to the situation
 - "Mafatiya Aya, Mafatiya Aya" "Chiman Chor" "bhare pani che, saheb. Khetar na taliyun miltu nathee"
- Point of view: Self, Autobiographical
- Even complex economic phenomenon are dealt with such an ease that even a layman can understand
- Many anecdotes but not as light as that in "English, August"
- Ideological bias: slightly left of the centre

CONTENT ANALYSIS

- Underlying Pathos
- Gradual decline of integrity among Bureaucrats
 - Pimputkar's "family ration card was suspended for misuse" by himself
 - Cabinet Secretary telling lies to PM
- Even sharper decline in the ethical standards and moral authority of politicians
 - Example of Babubhai Shah

WHAT IS MISSING

• Analysis is largely limited to establishment and economic issues.

• The scope of analysis of social sector is largely limited to Health Sector only.

RECOMMENDATION

- Highly recommended for young Public Servants, civil service aspirants and for all those who are seriously thinking of making a career in the Government.
- Keep the bias in mind.
- Read this book to understand:
 - Changing aspects of Public Administration and emerging issues
