- First election conducted in 2019

Transect walk

- Observatory walks across the village accompanied by the villagers
- Visit to households and interaction with the people
- Agricultural lands occupy about 55% of the geographical area of the village
- Roads are well developed
- Caste based division in settlements was seen
- Irrigation channels were well maintained
- Socio-economic and resource map was developed through people's participation
- Working of various institutions and activities carried out by the Gram Panchayat were also observed






Education : A MEANS FOR BRIGHTER FUTURE

- Ratio of Girls to Boys (enrolled) 3:2
- Parents are willing and aware of importance of education for their children
- Private Schooling DOMINATES

 - **Mana Ooru-Mana Badi Sheme (Our village Our School), for rejuvenation of school INFRA.**


HEALTH : The Real Wealth

- 
- There is a need for sub center in the village
 - 1 PHC in Chamanpally and 1 Sub Center in Cherlabhutkur
 - **1 ANM, 1 ASHA, 1 ANGANWADI** worker for the village
 - Basic medicines provided by ASHA as FIRST AID
 - Seasonal Diseases reported, no serious illness
 - 1 female doctor in Chamanpally handles pregnancy cases
 - No Diagnostics Equipment available at al the 4 sub centers
 - District Govt Hospital at Karimnagar (20 KMs)
 - Sufficient supply in the medicines, but public do not use them all
 - One Doctor for every sub center under Palle Dawakhana



- Every 2nd Saturday – immunization camp organized in the village
- ABHA card status --- in progress
- Ambulance facility in District Hospital only
- Infant Mortality Rate is not a case for concern (1 case in last 5 years)
- Only 2 cases reported in COVID Period
- 104 Medicine Ambulance ---- Once in a Month

Health Schemes



- AROGYA SCHEME : for surgery upto 5 lakhs for BPL card Holders
- Rs. 2000/- month to filarial patient (till cure)
- KCR Kit Scheme ----Baby kit and Financial Assistance---
 - For Boy – Rs.12000/- + Kit
 - For Girls – Rs.13000/- + Kit

Agriculture

- Main crop – Paddy
- Irrigation Sources
 1. Tube wells
 2. Canals
 3. Open wells
- 70% farmers have their own land
- 30% are tenants farmer



Types of soil

- Red Loamy soil
- Black cotton



Schemes related to Agriculture

- Rythu Bandhu – Per acre farmer get Rs. 5000
- Rythu Bima – Financial relief to dependents of farmer in case of loss of life (Rs. 5 lakhs)
- Loan waiver – Upto 1 lakh waiver



Classification of Farmers

- Small Farmers. 1- 5 acre
86%
- Medium Farmers. 5 – 7.5 acre
9.5%
- Large Farmers. 7.5 above acre
4.5%



Issues in agriculture

- Monoculture – Around 90% of farmers cultivate paddy only



Solution

- Practising crop rotation.
- Oil Palm initiative by Govt. of Telangana.
- Sowing pulses, which helps in nitrogen fixation.



Anganwadi





- Take care of 3 months pregnant mothers to 6 years old children
- 3 month – 6 month pregnant mothers are given 1 boiled egg + Supplement
- 6 month – 9 month pregnant mother are given 1 boiled egg + Supplement + Milk
- After baby birth – 16 eggs per month till 3 years
- 3 – 5 years children attend Anganwadi center where they are given 1 boil egg + snacks
- Every month height and weight of children is measured to check child growth and health monitoring card is maintained

Anganwadi

...



- If a child is found malnourished they are provided nutrition accordingly
- Primary education is being provided to the children up to 5 years of age.





Self Help Group

- 10 SHGs each group consists of 10 women
- 2 meeting held each month
- 1st meeting – Saving and loan payment
- 2nd meeting - Decide health & Nutrition, problem, discussion on loan requirements
- For each group one leader and one Assistant leader

Livestock Rearing & care

- Veterinary hospital is at Mandal level
- Each village has a GOPAL MITRA for immediate treatment
- Buffalos are reared in max houses
- No sheep as there are no shepherd community
- Treated 16 lumpy cases
- FMD vaccination in every 6 months
- Para grass is given as fodder





- Insurance only for animals bought on loan
- Deworming is done every six months



Telangana ku Haritha Harram

- Number of plants planted – 5778
- Number of plants survived – 3765
- Survival rate – 65.16%
- Sapling are planted on sides of roads and canal
- Increased the greenery of village
- Around 70% increase in green cover
- This is done under MNREGA





Vaikuntha dhammam

- Extent – 0.03 acres
- Inaugurated in 2020
- 2 platforms for cremation
- Separate washrooms for male and female
- Showers available
- Bio fencing





SEGREGATION SHED

- Extent – 0.02 Acres
- Garbage is separated into recyclable and non recyclable items
- Wet waste converted into compost
- Bio fencing available



Palle Pragathi vanam

- Extent – 0.13 acres
- Around 1600 plants
- Both fruit and flower bearing plants
- Walking track



Mission Bhageeratha

- All the households in the village have tap drinking water supply
- 40,000 Litres water provided to the village on daily basis
- Additional 80,000 Litres of water provided by Gram Panchayat to meet the demand of the village households



Swachh Bharat mission




- Village declared ODF+ in 2021
- Every household has its own toilets
- Segregation Shed is constructed at the outskirts
- Water quality of the village is checked regularly (frequency being 2 months)
- Disinfectant spray at regular intervals



MGNREGA

- All construction works regarding GP are done by workers of MGNREGA
- Demand for work by villagers is met within a week
- 110 Job Cards, 293 Wage Seekers
- Average Wage Rate provided (latest) – Rs. 272
- Bills for clearance of payments submitted every week



Pensions

- 44 Old Age Pension Beneficiaries (Rs.2016/- month)
- 4 Disabled Pensioners (Rs. 3016/- month)
- 9 Widow Pensioners (Rs. 2016/- month)



Shaadi Mubarak/kalyan lakshmi

- **13 Beneficiaries registered with GP Secretary**
- **Helping the Bride family to cater some of the expenses in marriage**
- **Started in 2016 with 51000/- per cases, now enhanced to 1,00,116/-**



Dalitha bandhu


- For SC BPL Card holder
