- Rajanna Sircilla District
- Distance from Rajanna Sircilla district HQ 24 kms
- Total Geographical Area: 1782
 Acres
- No. of Households: 1200
- Total population of gram panchayat: 4328(Female: 2174, Male: 2154)
- > SC: 636, ST: 26
- > Assembly constituency: Sircilla
- ➤ Main Crops: Rice and Cotton







Transect Walk

- > Started early at 7AM of Day 1. Covered the perimeter and interior part of the village.
- Accompanied by villagers and elected members.
- Main Road to Primary School—Sub Post office- Crematorium- Library Dump Yard Heritage Site- lake- Paddy Fields- Temple.
- Major portion of the village is surrounded by rice cultivation with few portion of Cotton.
- ➤ People met Farmers, Labors, MGNREGA workers.
- Concrete, Tar Road and Muddy roads.
- > Street lights are provided at regular intervals in the interior and perimeter area.
- ➤ 40 CCTV cameras are installed in the village.
- Door to door garbage collection.
- Village Park, soak pits and open gym.











Timeline



Primary School

- Established in 1961.

- Staff strength: 8 Teachers
- Panchayat of the village.
- Students can read and write in English and Telugu.



Higher Secondary School

- Established in 1985
- ► 471 students (244 boys & 227 girls)
- Digital Classrooms and common dining hall.
- Telangana Kreeda Pranganam.
- Students can read and write in English.
- Diversity in mid day meal has improved nutrition level.
- Separate toilets for boys and girls.







Anganwadi

- 5 Anganwadi located at different places.
- There were 93 children, 36 pregnant women and 36 lactating mothers enrolled in Anganwadi.
- Maintenance of records and timely provision of food and other items to students is commendable.
- The provision of providing extra food in form of boiled 1 egg and 100ml milk to malnutrition children is an effective strategy.
- Have facilities for children like toys, weighing machine and instruments for creative learning.

Rythu Vedika

- Established in 2020.
- The main objective of the scheme is to provide a lot of higher returns to the farmers who are struggling to get good returns.

Soil testing should be done and recorded.



Crop diversification is needed, there is over-dependence on rice cultivation.







Gram Panchayat

- Located at the center of the village.
- Proper drinking water facility.
- Elected members were approachable.
- Street lighting, sanitation were available.
- House tax collection for maintenance of street lights, drainage and for library.
- Digital services are present.
- CCTX Cameras for surveillance.

MGNREGA Nursery

- 6 plants given to every house hold in the village at free of cost.
- Nursery maintained to increase green cover.
- Regular monitoring of given saplings.





PDS Shop

- 6 kg is distributed per person per family for BPL card holders.
- 35 kg rice is provided per family.





Interaction with SC/ST community

- 14.6% of SC and 0.83% of ST Population.
- Pension benefit and mission Bhagirathi implemented in full scale.
- Children studying in the village school and also in a private school in Boppapur.
- Satisfied with the health benefits of Aarogyasri scheme provided.
- ► A common SC/ST community hall for gathering.



Sub-Post office


- Established around 1990s.

 - o Pay on monthly basis.








Bathukamma Celebration

■ Bathukamma is a adherent lover of flowers. The seasonal flowers of spring are arranged on a square bamboo frame or square wooden plank with the size of frames that is hardly tapering off to directly form a pinnacle on top. It looks like the shape of a temple tower or 'Gopura'. On top of the flowers, a lump of turmeric is kept.


- Sticks of different lengths provided.

 - o Agricultural Employment



MGNREGA:

- Total no. of jobcards (2023-24)-790.
- Average days employment per Households-20.98
- ► Total Expenditure : 25.3 Lakhs

Following works are included under this scheme:

- Soak pits construction and its maintenance by each household.
- Crematorium facility under Vaikuntha Dhamam scheme.
- Village Park under Palle Pragthi Vanaalu scheme.





Vaikunta Dhamam:

- The initiative seeks to establish a respectful space for cremation and burial purpose.
- Total of 12 Lakh Rupees from MGNREGS funds were utilized to create two cremation platforms, a waiting hall, and a women's restroom.
- Ongoing project to construct a compound wall is being supported by a donation of 50,000.





Palle Pragathi Vanaalu:

The village park project has focused on developing 0.5 acres of land, incurring a cost of Rs. 72,677. The maintenance and tree plantation, carried out as part of the MGNREGS scheme encompasses a variety of trees such as Tekoma, Pycus, Gulmohari, tangedi, Coconut, Conocorpus, Mandara, Ganneru, Mango, Guava, Custard apple, Pannasa.



Mission Bhagiratha:

- Primary objective 100 LPCD of drinking water to every household.
- The water treatment plant is strategically positioned at the village entrance.
- ► Furthermore, regular cleaning of the overhead water tank is also undertaken as part of the scheme's maintenance efforts.



Rythu Bandhu (Input subsidy) scheme:

- assistance of Rs. 5000 per acre per season to ensure that farmers have timely access to funds for purchasing agriculture necessities such as seeds, fertilizer and costs associated with preparing their farms. This initiative has yielded the following impact:
 - 838 farmer benificeries
 - Total disbursement of Rs. 67,90,472.
- As a result, farmers are liberated from relying on money lenders and incurring high interest loans from banks.



Swachh Bharat Mission:

- Each household and institution is equipped with toilets.
- A dedicated vehicle is employed for daily garbage collection, additionally, a segregation facility is established to classify biodegradable and non -biodegradable waste.
- The biodegradable waste is subsequently transformed into valuable manure through appropriate processes.
