- To alleviate financial distress of SC/ST and minorities family
- Rs 1,00,116 one-time financial assistance



Arogya Lakshmi

- Launched on 1st Jan, 2015
- For pregnant and lactating women and children < 6 yrs of age through Anganwadis centre
- One nutritious meal everyday consisting:-
 - 200ml milk for 25 days a month and an egg every day (for women)
 - 16 eggs a month with 2.5 Kg food packet (children of 7 months- 3 yrs)
 - 1 egg a day with rice, dal, vegetables and snacks (children of 3-6 yrs)
- 8 lactating and 8 pregnant women in Rukmapur as on date.



AASARA PENSION

- To ensure secured life with dignity for all the poor and vulnerable sections including:-
 - the old and infirm
 - people with HIV/AIDS
 - widows
 - incapacitated weavers
 - toddy tappers
- Earlier 65 yrs, now 58 yrs of age required
- Rs 3016 for disabled people and Rs 2016 per month for others

RICE DISTRIBUTION (PDS)

- 6 Kg rice per member of family, free of cost
- 35 Kg rice per family to AAY card holders
- 2 PDS stores in Rukmapur
- 827 card holder families

- Crematorium made in 2021
- 2 Platforms and separate bathrooms for male and female

 - Drinking water could be provided

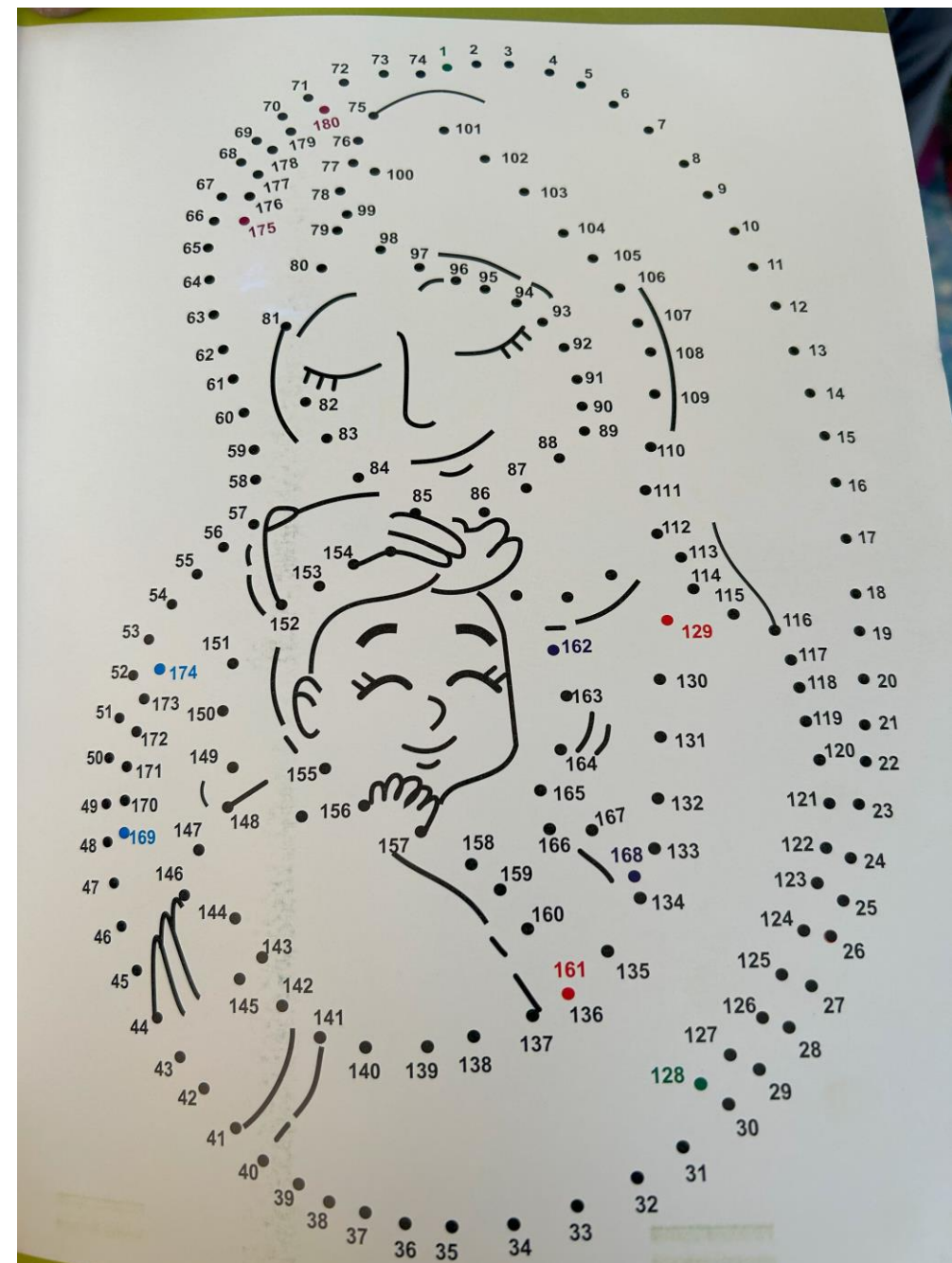

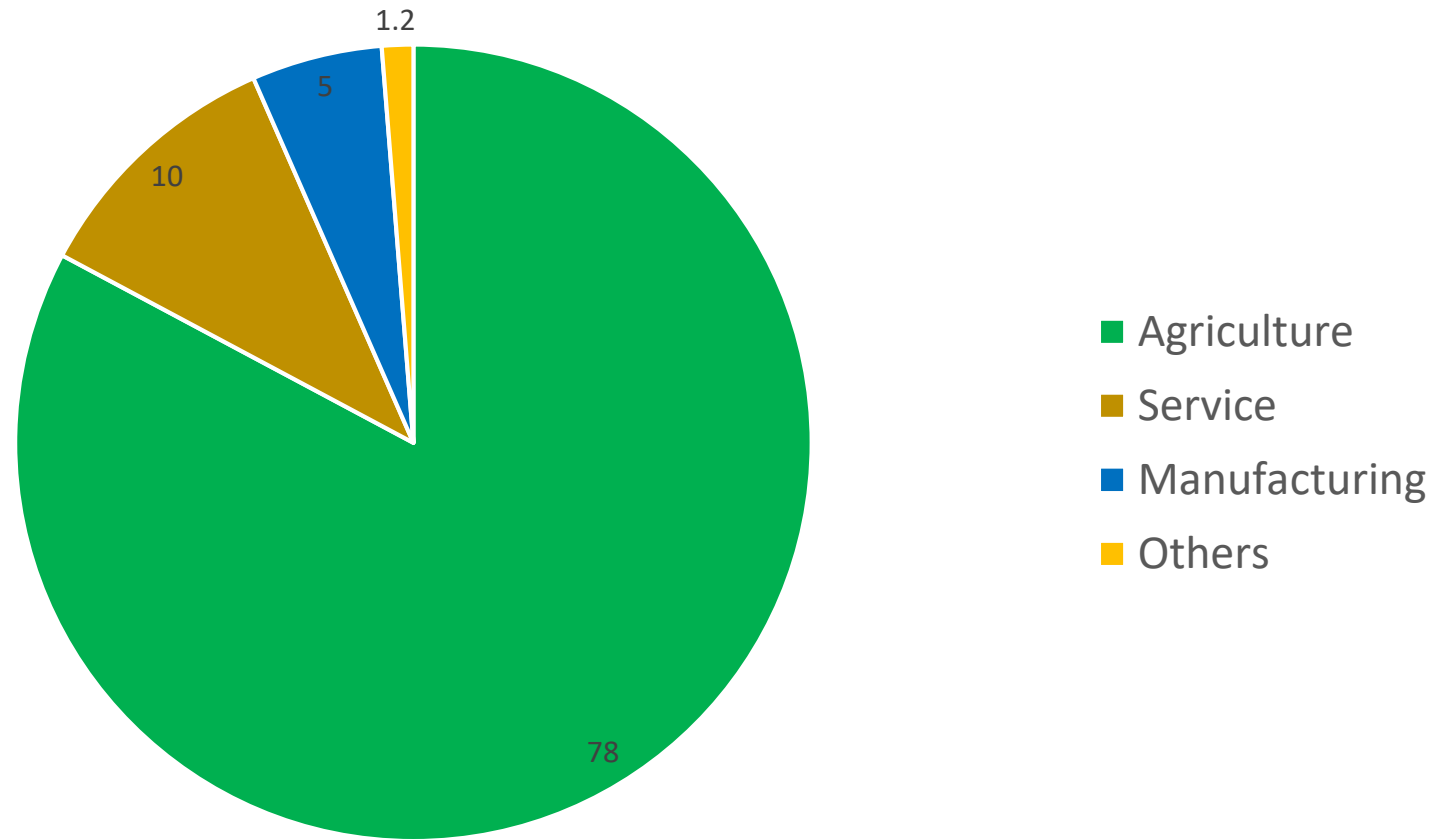

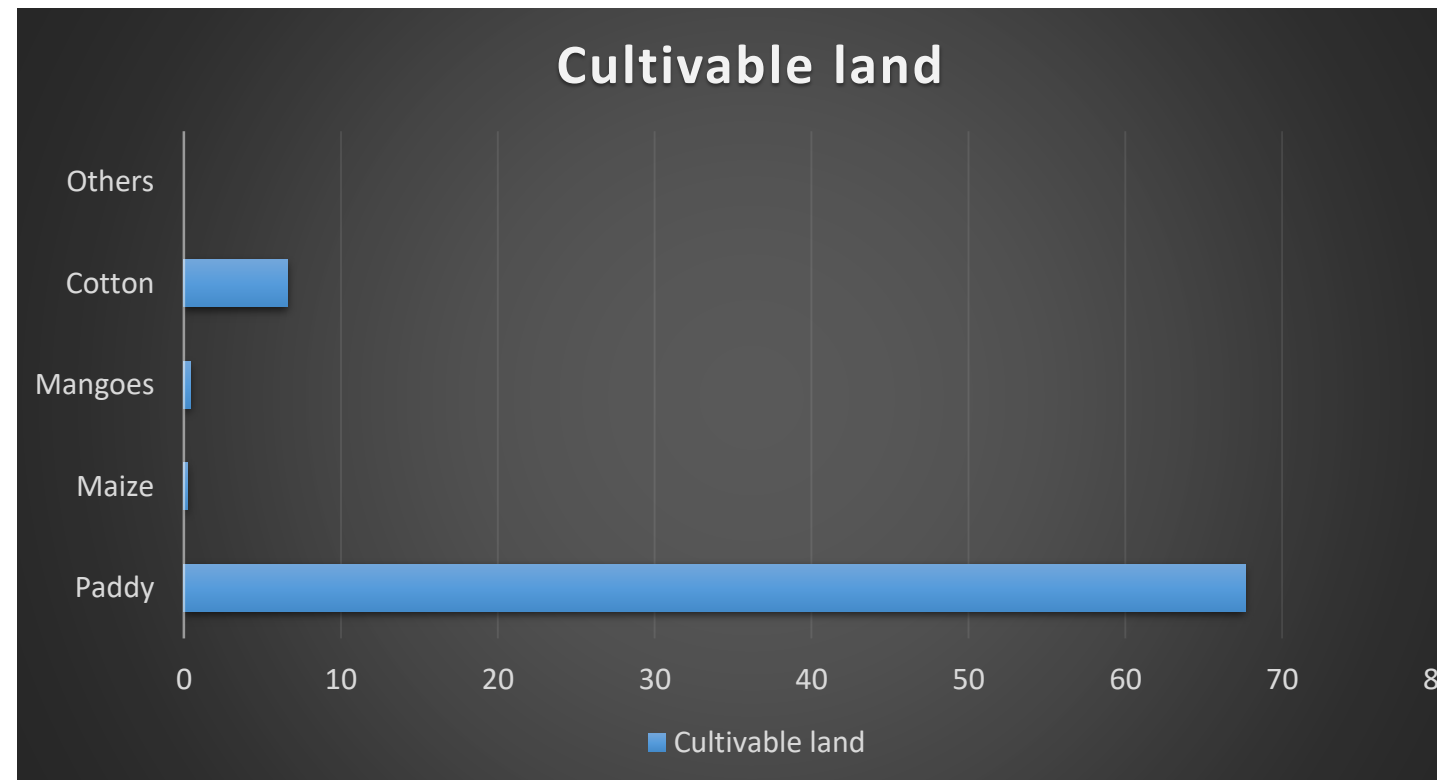




Agriculture

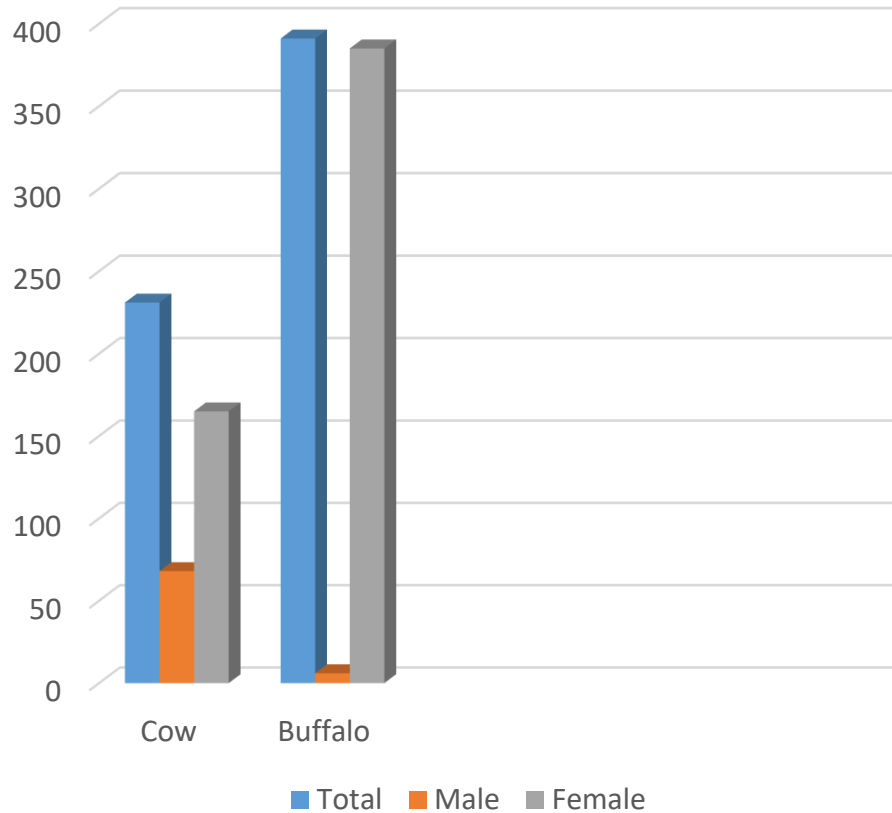

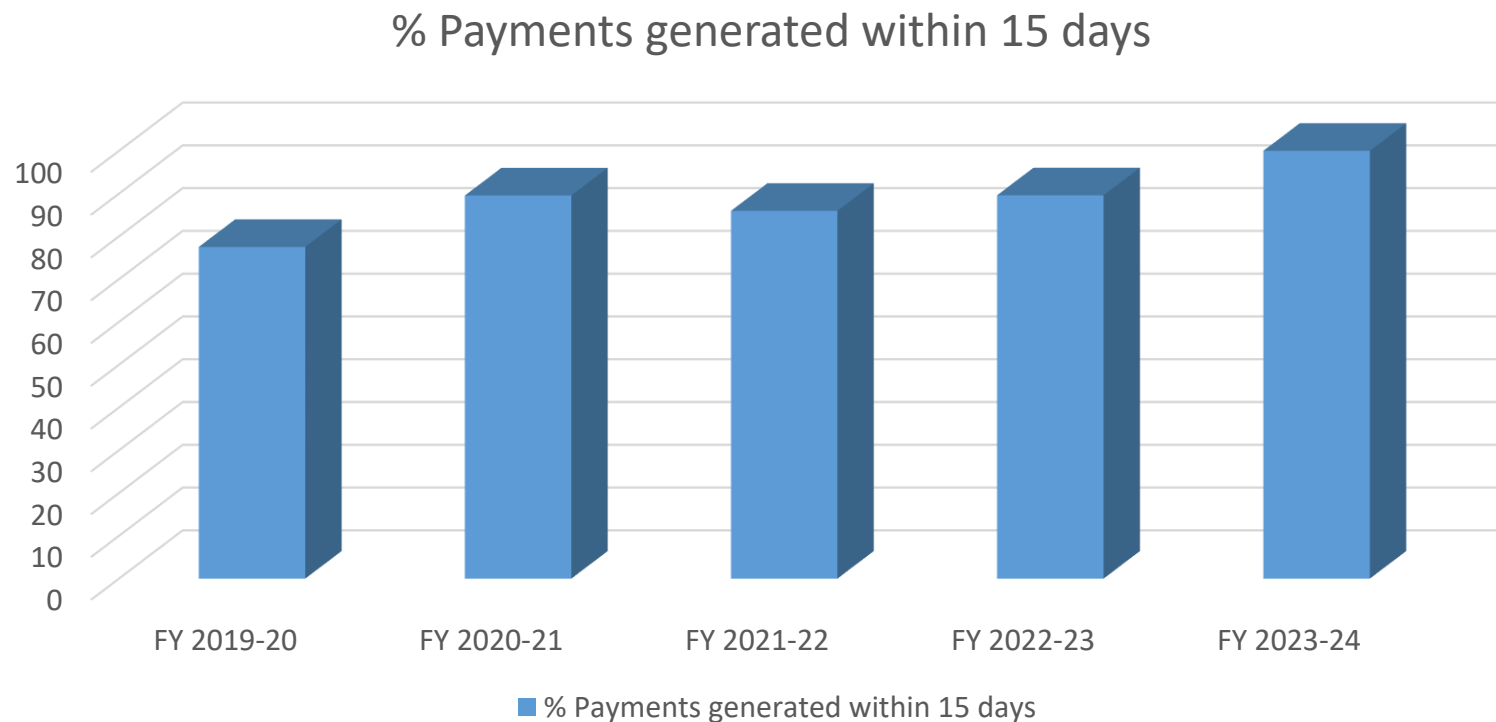
