AGRICULTURE

- > Agriculture is the prime source of income for most of the families of the village.
- Paddy is the main crop sown twice a year once in Rabi season and once in Kharif season.
- The village has around 3951 acres of land out of which 1904 acres is used for cultivation.
- Main source of irrigation is groundwater, 152 bore well(392 Acres), pond and 6 major check dam(540 Acres).





Gas is used in households for cooking purpose.




RÝTHU VEDIKA

SCHEMES

1. RYTHU BANDHU-

- > The scheme was implemented in 2018.
- > The scheme offers a financial help of ₹10,000 per year to each farmer (two crops).
- > There is no cap on the number of acres.

Coverage-

Under this scheme 1028 landholders of Solakpalle are getting benefits in 2023-24.

Impact-

Farmers are getting timely payments therefore their reliance on unsecured loans for farming activities has come down.

2. RÝTHU BIMA SCHEME

- Eligibility: Farmers in the state of Telangana are eligible to apply for the Rythu Bima Scheme.
- Implementation: The scheme is implemented by the Department of Agriculture, Government of Telangana
- Premium: The premium for the scheme is 2% of the sum insured for non-loanee farmers and 1% of the sum insured for loanee farmers. The government of Telangana provides a subsidy of 75% of the total premium amount for all farmers.
- **Sum insured:** The sum insured under the scheme is based on the value of the crop and the area cultivated. The minimum sum insured is Rs. 5,000 per acre, and the maximum sum insured is Rs. 1,50,000 per acre.
- **Coverage:** The Rythu Bima Scheme covers crops such as paddy, cotton, maize, chilies, turmeric, and other vegetables and fruits.
- Claims: In case of crop damage, the farmer can claim compensation equal to the sum insured.
 The claim process is simple, and the payment is made directly to the farmer's bank account
- The farmer's Group Life Insurance Scheme ensures financial security and relief to the bereaved members of the farmer's family. Farmers in the age group of 18 to 59 years are eligible for enrollment under the scheme. The entire premium is paid by the government to the Life Insurance Corporation of India.In the event of the death of the enrolled farmer due to any cause including natural death, the insured amount of 5.00 Lakhs INR) is deposited into the designated nominee account within (10) days.
- 9 claims of **The farmer's Group Life Insurance Scheme** has been settled in 2022-2023

3. PM KISAN SAMMAN NIDHI-

Under the scheme, financial benefit has been provided to all Small and Marginal landholder farmer families with total cultivable holding upto 2 hectares with a benefit of Rs.6000 per annum per family payable in three equal installments, every four months.

Along with Rythu Bandhu, this scheme is very beneficial for the farmers.

> 315 farmers of Solakpalle are beneficiaries of this scheme.

It is observed that many farmers are deprived of registration for this scheme.

EDUCATION

- 1 Primary School (upto 5th class) with 44 enrollment of boys and girls.
- The school has 1 large playground.
- Total literacy rate is 51.7% (Male-61.31% Female-41.97%).



HEALTH CARE FACILITIES

- > 1 ANM, 3 ASHA workers.
 - Vaccination day Wednesday
- It was established 30 years ago, before that district hospital was the only healthcare facility.
- > 650 individuals got vaccinated during covid.
- > Nutrition kit is being provided in pregnancy and KCR kit is provided after delivery.
- > Awareness program is running for family planning.
- Personal Medical Report of pregnant lady is maintained by Asha Worker on regular basis.
 SCHEME :
- Kanti velgu scheme, under this scheme 400 individuals have got their eye tested and 78 were given spectacles.
- > <u>Mission indradhanush</u> is being implemented for vaccination.
- <u>Arogyasri-</u> for providing a sum of 2 lacs for medical expenses.


- > 8 healthy baby birth during last one year (5 Male + 3 Female)

- Height, weight, lactating mothers, pregnant ladies, stunting, vaccination, food distribution register, stock register.
- Nutrition kits are provided to pregnant ladies in 4th and 7th months of pregnancy.
- Breakfast and meals to children.
- KCR kits are provided to mothers post delivery for 6 months.
- ₹13,000 are given to newly born girls and ₹12,000 to newly born boys.
- Kishora Balika Scheme: This scheme covers girls of age group 11-18 for taking care of their nutritional level and personal hygiene.

SHADI MUBARAK/KALYAN LAKSHMI

- ₹1,00,116 are provided to the family for wedding of the girl child.
- The scheme benefit can also be claimed post wedding within 1 year.
- This scheme saved many families from debt.

SELF HELP GROUPS

- SHGs are informal associations of people to come together to find ways to improve their living conditions.
- Total 32 SHGs are active in the village with 352 members.
- The corpus is then used to lend amount to the needy members of the group at a reasonable interest rate.
- To boost the growth of such SHGs State govt also provides help of Rs. 20 lakh to such groups through Telangana Gramin Bank.
- This amount is provided at 12% per annum which will be reduced to 3% per annum if the EMIs are paid within due time for a particular number of years.

BPL FAMILIES

• There are total 400 BPL families in Solakpalle.

• There are various schemes for them, i.e. Free Rice, widow/old age pension, Mission Bhageeratha, Ujala, Mission Ujwala etc.





PDS SHOP

- 6 kg rice is distributed per person per family for BPL card holders.
- 35 kg rice is provided per card for APL families.





MANREGS

Objective

Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme aims to enhance livelihood security in rural areas by providing at least 100 days of wage employment in a financial year to at least one member of every household whose adultmembers volunteer to do unskilled manual work.




• Impact

- It provide employment to villager within village.
- It is provided opportunity of work to ladies who can not go to cities for work.
- It also helped in development of Solakpalle by building Streets, Rythu Vedika, Dumping Yard, Crematorium, Nursery etc through MNREGS.
- Main work under this scheme is provided in Summer Season.
 - Desilting of water dams before rainy season starts.
 - Plantation work.

SWACHH BHARAT MISSION

- Intitled ODF++ tag
- Underground Sewerage System is being implemented in village.
- Constructing toilet is compulsory for taking permission for new house constructions
- All households have proper sanitation facilities.
- Dry Day- Friday: Change water in households every Friday.
- Received Swachh Survekshan Awards for the year 2022.



DUMPING YARD

- Located on the outskirt of village.
- Waste is collected by tractor from village
- Wet waste and dry waste are segregated from each other.
- Compost is prepared from decomposable waste and used as manure in nursery.
- Recyclable waste is sold monthly and money is used for fuel of the tractor.
- Dumping of waste is done on the regular basis.
- It also provides source of income as it generates livelihood.

MISSION BHAGIRATHA

• To ensure safe and sustainable PIPED drinking water supply at:

- 100 LPCD (litres per capita per day) is provided in village.
- There are 3 water tanks in Solakpalle under this scheme.
