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# A PEEK INTO THIMMAKKAPALLE (KAMAREDDY)

- Kamareddy→ Thimmakkapalle
- Was part of Gram Panchayat (GP) Chinamallareddy until 1980 and thereafter became a separate GP.
- Village is divided into two colony by main Road connecting district headquarters.
- Only 9 Km from Kamareddy which is a bustling town and 110 km from State Capital Hyderabad.
- Solar Power plant nearby this village of worth Rs. 600 crores Sun Shakti Project Pvt. Ltd provides electricity to the district headquarters.
- No shortage of water for irrigation: irrigation is done by using water from pond and from tubewells.
- About 76% of the land area is covered by agricultural fields.
- Key Occupations: Agriculture – Paddy , Maize, Cotton.
- Milk production, Sheep Rearing.
- Working in Rice Mills as labourer/driver.

# INTERACTION WITH PANCHAYAT WORKERS AND OTHER OFFICIALS.

- Interaction with various village officials such as Panchayat Secretary, Health Workers, Anganwadi Workers and Self Help Groups (SHG).
- Interaction with villagers.





# TRANSECT WALK

- Observatory walks across the village accompanied by the villagers and Panchayat Workers.
- Visit to households and interaction with the people.
- Agricultural lands occupy about 76% of the geographical area of the village Roads are properly maintained.
- Caste based division in settlements was not seen.
- Irrigation facilities are well maintained for all seasons.
- Resource map was developed through people's participation.
- Working of various institutions and activities carried out by the Gram Panchayat were also observed.
- People were seen performing rituals during the Bathukamma festival.
- It was found that most of the houses in the village were very old with tilted roof and many houses were Kuccha houses made of clay.

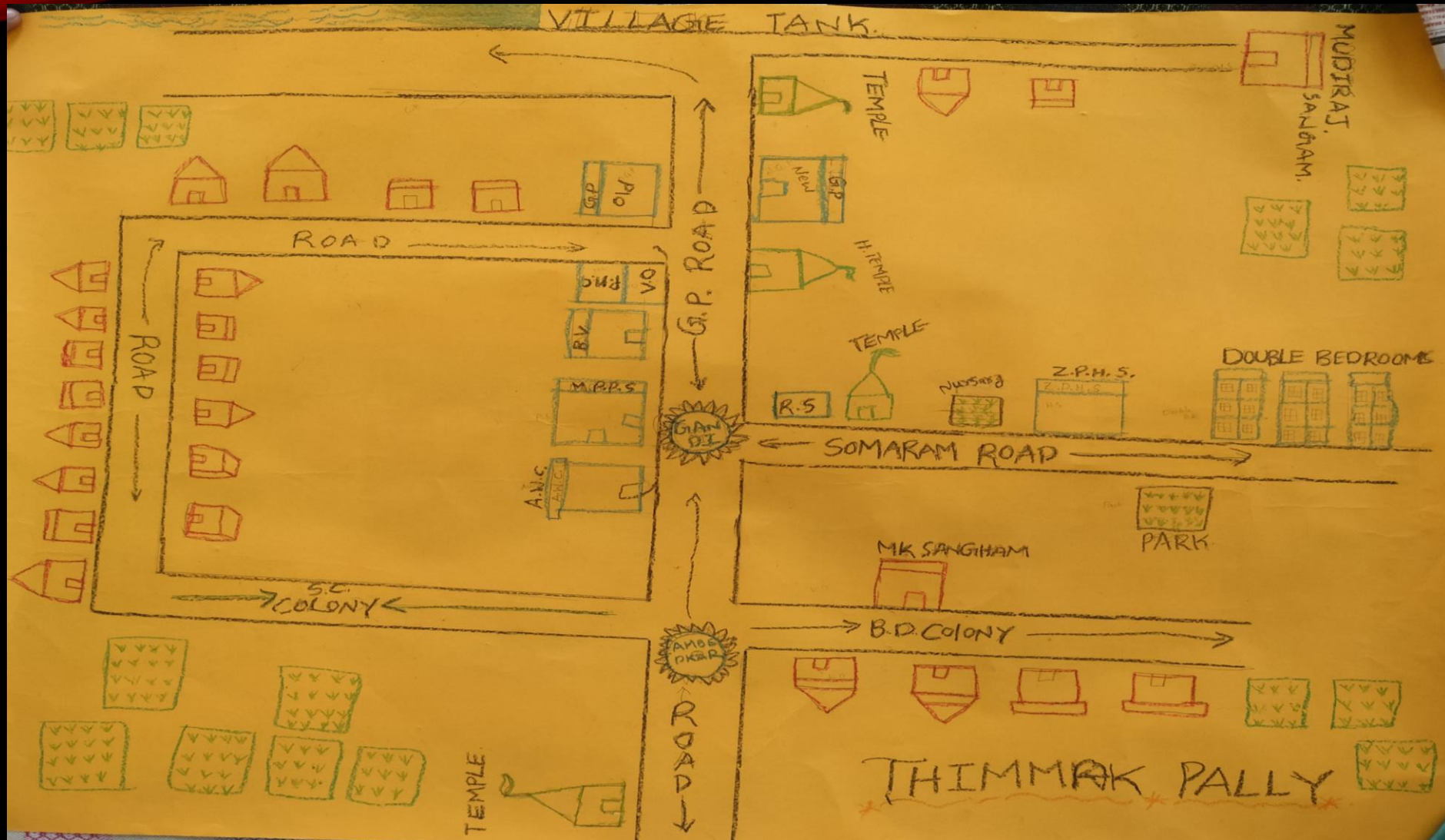

# EDUCATION

## ■ AREA OF IMPROVEMENT :

- Lack of proper infrastructure in High School.
- Quality of food is not up to the mark & mess is in unhygienic condition.





# ANGANWADI CENTERS

- 2 Anganwadi centers
- Out of 90 enrolled children 79 are regular attende.





## ■ REGISTER MAINTENANCE :

- Height, weight, Lactating mother, Pregnant lady, Stunted growth, Vaccination, Food distribution register, Stock register.
- Provides Nutrition kit to Pregnant ladies in 4<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> month of pregnancy.
- Bala amritam kit for children.
- Breakfast and meals to children.





## SCHEME:

- **Arogya Lakshmi scheme.**

## IMPACT :

- **zero infant mortality rate and maternal death during delivery.**
- **8 healthy baby birth during last one year ( 5 Male + 3 Female)**
- **No case of stunted growth or underweight children.**
- **Early childhood learning with better nutrition which results in overall development of a child.**

## AREA OF IMPROVEMENT :

- **Quality of food is not upto par as per villagers.**
- **One Anganwadi center is being run in old private building.**



# HEALTH CARE FACILITIES.

- 1 health sub center.
- 2 ANM, 2 ASHA workers and 1 Mid-Level Health care Provider (MLHP).
- It was established 30 years ago, before that district hospital was the only healthcare facility.
- 850 individuals got vaccinated during covid.
- KCR kits are provided.



## SCHEME :

- Kanti velgu scheme, under this scheme 728 individuals have got their eye tested and 500 were given spectacles.
- Mission Indradhanush, Scheme was properly implemented in village.

# IMPACT :

- First aid at village level.
- vital role in immunization during covid period.
- Providing free medicine for B.P, Sugar and non-communicable disease.

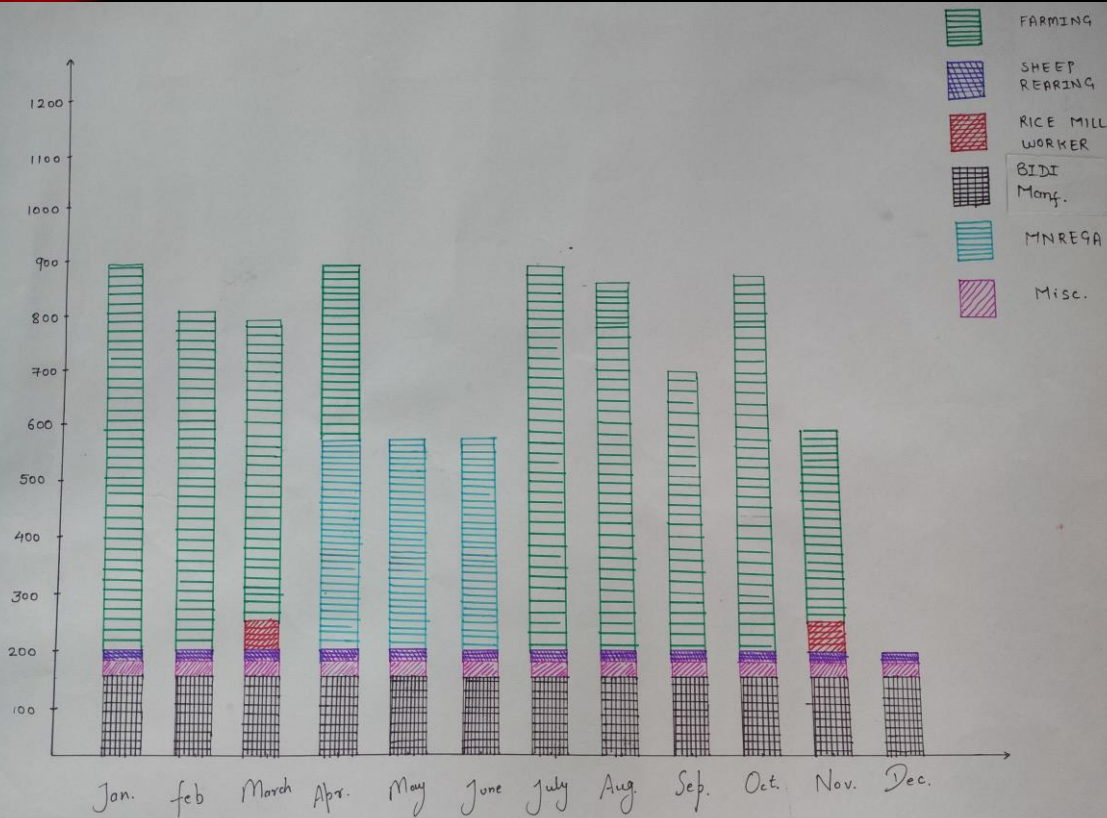

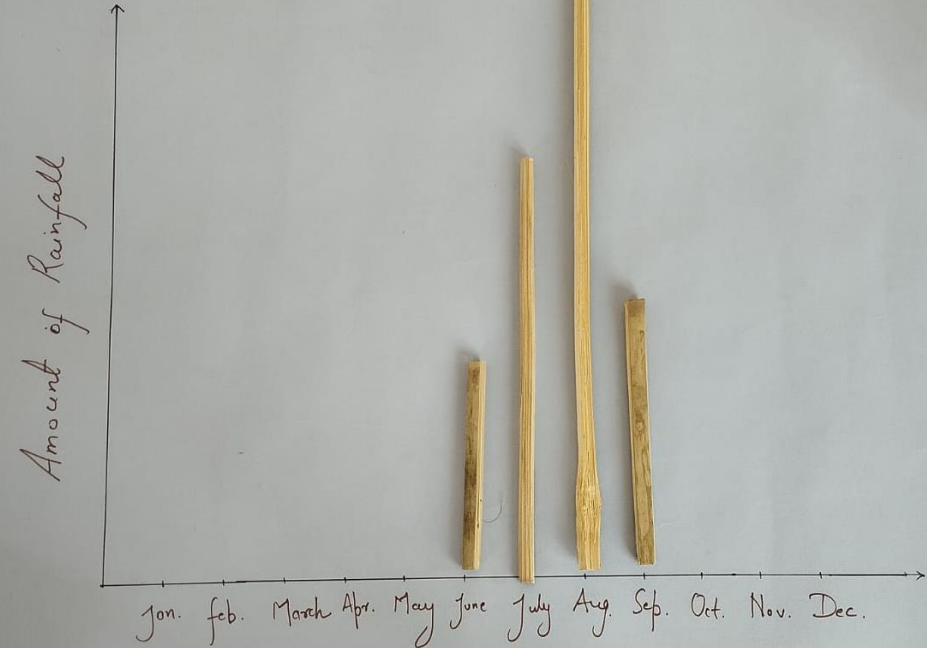


# BAR GRAPH SHOWING MEANS OF LIVELIHOOD

# AGRICULTURE

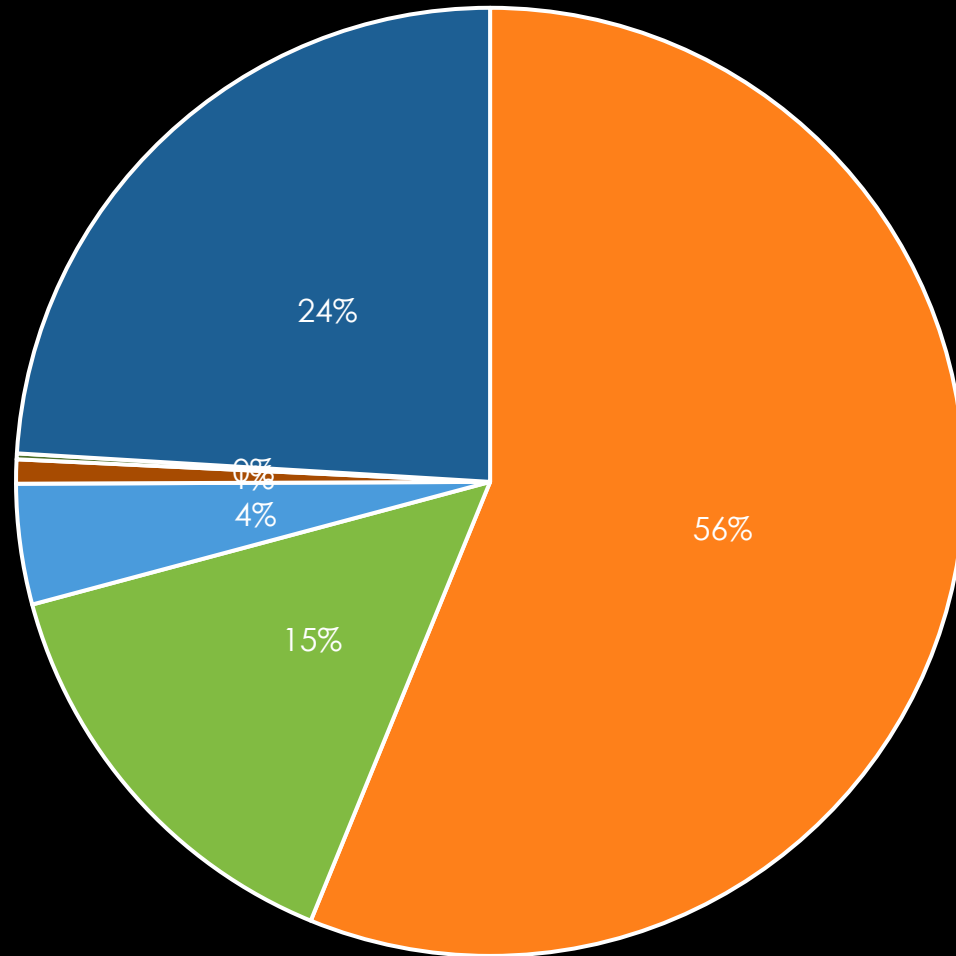
- Agriculture is the prime source of income for most of the families of the village.
- Monocropping is followed by most of the farmers where they grow paddy all round the year.
- Apart from paddy they grow cotton, maize, soyabean and Bengal gram.
- The village has around 850 acres of land out of which 653 acres is used for cultivation.
- The average per acre yield for paddy is about 28-30 quintal.
- Source of irrigations for the village are pond, tubewell and rain water.

# SCHEMES

## 1. ***Rythu Bandhu-***

- The scheme was implemented on May 10, 2018.
- Under this scheme 567 landholders of the village are getting benefits.

### IMPACT-

- Farmers are getting timely payments therefore their reliance on unsecured loans for farming activities has come down.

## 2. ***Rythu Bima-***

- Under this scheme 6 families have benefitted during the last 2 years.

### IMPACT-

- Families are able to get their bread and butter even after the demise of the earning hand.



## **PM Kisan-**

- Under the scheme all the farmers are getting benefitted and getting Rs. 6000 per year.
- Along with Rythu Bandhu, this scheme is very beneficial for the farmers.

## **➤ Rythu Vedika-**

- Under this scheme farmers are getting training through weekly meetings at cluster HQ.

## **➤ Impact-**

- Farmers are becoming more aware of the new innovation in field of agriculture, pest management and about high yielding variety seeds.
- The average paddy yield acre has increased from 20-22 quintal to 28-30 quintal.

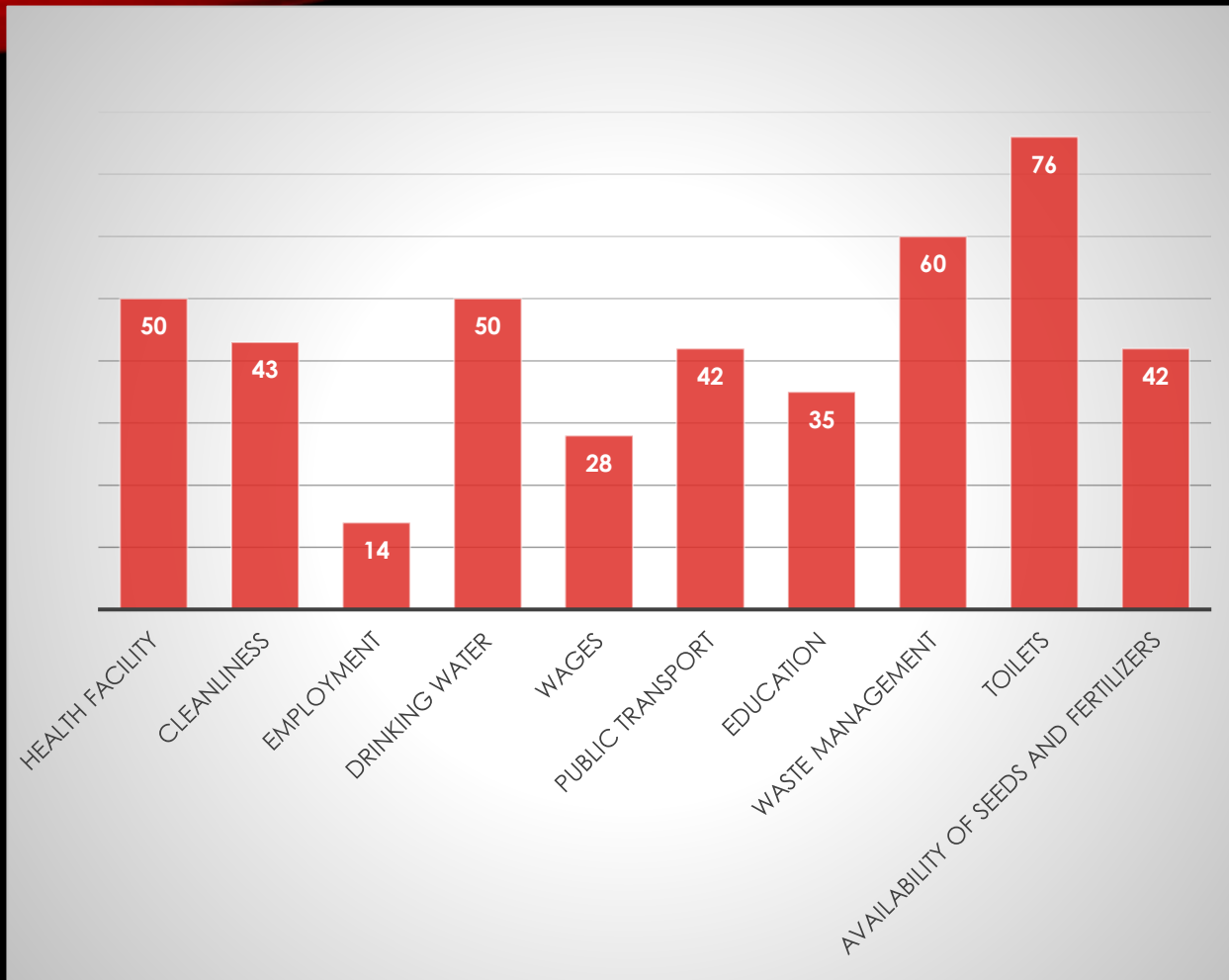

# SELF HELP GROUPS

- SHGs are informal association of people to come together to find ways to improve their living conditions.
- Total 32 SHGs are active in the village, each having 10 members.
- contribution of Rs. 200 per month from each member.
- The corpus is then used to lend money to the needy members of the group at a reasonable interest rate.
- To boost the growth of such SHGs State govt also provides help of Rs. 20 lakh to such groups through Telangana Gramin Bank.
- This amount is provided at 12% per annum which may be reduced to 3% per annum if the EMIs are paid within due time for a particular number of years.



## IMPACT :

- It helps in securing collateral free loan.
- 3 People availed loan from SHGs which helped them start general stores.

**These Self Help Groups are a kind of Non Banking Financial Corporations working at the grass root level and help poor people secure loans at very reasonable rates without any collateral.**





# MID DAY MEAL SCHEME

- In this scheme lunch is provided by the government to the school students.
- The aim of this scheme is to better the nutritional standing of school age children.
- Provided at Primary School campus.

## AREA OF IMPROVEMENT :

- Cooking in unhygienic kitchen.



# COMPOST SHED

- Garbage is segregated and organic waste is then used for making compost.
- Tractor and trolley are available for garbage collection.

## ISSUES :

- Difficulty in segregation
- No provision of recycling of plastic waste
- Dump yard is full of stray dogs.





# VAIKUNTHA DHAMAM

- One crematorium in the outskirts of village with all facilities.





# **TELANGANA KU HARITHA HAARAM**



- About 10 lakh saplings have been planted with survival rate 90%
- 5 km Avenue plantation, increases the green cover area.
- Workers get work in the Nursery through MGNREGS and plants and trees and planted throughout the village at marked areas.



# VILLAGE PARK & POND

- Park is constructed under *Palle Pragathi Vanaalu Scheme*
- Pond provides water supply throughout the year and its main source of replenishment is rain water.





## **MISSION BHAGEERATHA**

- Two water tanks with storage capacity of 40,000 litres each
- Water taps are installed in all the houses of the village
- Every day water is provided for 1 hour each during morning and evening

### **IMPACT-**

- Treated drinking water is available for all houses
- Reduced wastage of water





# KALYAN LAKSHMI

- To provide financial assistance for girl child's wedding at/above marriageable age.

## Coverage

- Under this scheme 32 families have availed the benefits of the scheme.

## Impact

- It provides financial securities to weaker family.
- Drastic decrease in child marriage.

## **DALITHA BANDHU**

Provides financial assistance of 10 Lakh to SC youth.

### **Coverage**

- Financial assistance to 9 members have been approved, amount will disbursed to beneficiaries after Vidhan Sabha elections.

### **Impact**

- It has encouraged youth for entrepreneurship.

## **SHEEP REARING**

### **Coverage**

- Under this scheme 21 sheep have been proved to 9 sheep rears.

### **Impact**

- It provides means of livelihood to poor families.





# SWACCH BHARAT MISSION

- All the households have toilets and the village has achieved the status of ODF+.
- The overall cleanliness of the village is good.

## PDS Ration shop

- 30 kg of rice has provided to eligible families.

## Impact

- Food security for BPL families.



# PENSION

- Pension is provided to various category of beneficiaries:
- Old age :90 person
- Bidi workers:152 person
- Widow pension: 9 person
- Single woman: 9 person
- Physically handicapped: 30 person
- Taddy taper: 1





# BATHUKAMMA FESTIVAL

- A floral festival of Gauri celebrated by the women beginning Pitru Amavasya.
- In Telugu, Bathukamma means Mother Goddess come Alive.





- Festival is celebrated with joy and gaiety, during these celebrations, there are dance performances, music, dramas and variety of entertainments as thousands of tourists and locals too, flock to witness the happenings.
- On the final day immersion of Bathukamma in water bodies is celebrated with utmost devotion and enthusiasm with rhythmic drum beats throughout the village in evening offering a beautiful, calming and a peaceful visual treat.
