Introduction to Golilingala Village

- NagiReddypet Mandal
- Kamareddy District
- Distance from district HQ: 46 kms
- Total Area: 1039 Acres
- No. of Houses: 318
- Total population of gram panchayat: 1259(Female: 656, Male: 603)
- SC: 316, ST: 24,
- Main Crops: Peddy, Maize and Sugarcane



Transect Walk

- Started early at 7AM. Covered the perimeter and interior part of the village.
- Accompanied by villagers and elected members.
- Main Road to Gram Panchayat - primary school – Upper Primary School – Anganwadi Centers- ration shop – water tanks - Crematorium- Segregation Shed - Palle Pragathi Vanalu -Agricultural Fields.
- Major portion of the village is surrounded by Paddy cultivation.
- People met – Farmers, Labors, Pensioners.
- Concrete, Tar roads and Gravel roads.
- Street lights are provided in regular intervals in the interior and perimeter area.
- Visited Park, Nursery, and Rythu Vedika.

Upper Primary School Visit

- 84 Students (43 boys and 41 girls)
- Staff strength: 7
(sanctioned strength: 8)

Issues

- No benches for Students.
- Infrastructure can be improved
- Slow implementation of ***MANA OORU MANA BADI*** scheme.





Health Sub Centre Visit

- 1 ANM
- 1 ASHA worker (per 1000 population)
- Vaccination program and other health awareness programmes conducted i.e. Monitoring Pregnancy, Primary health checkup etc.
- Availability of First aid medical equipment and medicines.

Issues

- Lack of infrastructure including Refrigerator



Anganwadi visit

- Distance of 200 m from the center of the village.
- There were 13 children, 09 pregnant women enrolled in Anganwadi
- Proper nutritious diet was available
- Anganwadi is facilitated with LPG connection.
- Regular monitoring of Weight and height of children and uploading the data on the **e-Sadhana** (nutrition & health tracking system) portal.

Issues

- Don't have recreational facilities for children like toys and playground.
- Attendance of children were less.



Rythu Vedika Visit

- Discussion on farming activities & counseling, meetings conducted twice a week.
- Each Rythu Vedika covers 6 Gram Panchayats.
- Periodic soil testing is done and recorded.

Issues

- Crop diversification is needed, there is over-dependence on rice cultivation.



Self Help Group

- Total 32 groups
- 10 Member in each group.
- Participant- Women.
- Basically the purpose of the Group is to provide the loan for small economic activities.
- Maximum amount of loan is upto Rs.20 lakh for each group.
- Interest rate for loan is 9-12% p.a. (if premium is paid timely, interest is borne by the state government).

Issues

- Separate building for meeting of SHG members.
- Lack of financial literacy and skills.



Dumping Yard

- It is situated outside habitations.
- Waste segregated into plastic, glass, organic and e-waste.
- Vermicomposting using various worms.
- The revenue generated used for village development activities.

Issues

- Lack of regular waste collection & segregation.



MGNREGA

- 416 job cards registered , 394 Active Cards
- No progressive work under MGNREGA in this financial year due to lesser demand.

Following works are included under this scheme :-

- Plantation under Telangana Ku Haritha Haaram scheme (Nursery).
- Crematorium facility under Vaikuntha Dhamam scheme
- Village Park under Palle Pragathi Vanaalu scheme
- Construction of Rythu Vedika building.
- Gravel roads
- CC roads built under this scheme.

Issues

- 3-Month payment is pending.



Vaikuntha Dhaamam

- The initiative seeks to establish a respectful space for financial ceremonies.
- Total of 5.2Lakh Rs. from MGNREGS funds were utilized to create cremation platform, a waiting hall , and a women's restroom.
- The crematorium area lacked dustbins.
- Work is under Progress.



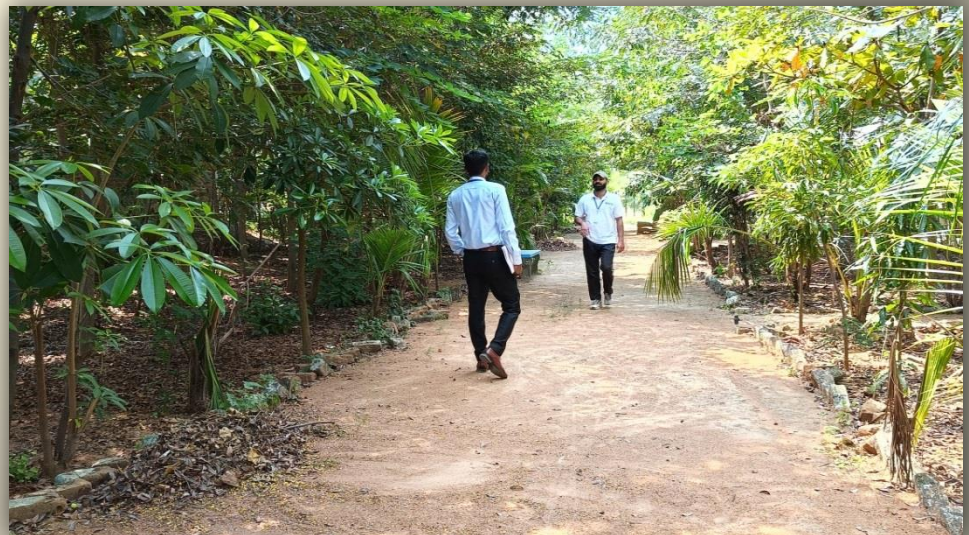
Telangana Ku Haritha Haaram

- The scheme's goal is to raise the existing green cover from 24% to 33%.
- Currently, the village boast a green cover, their diverse effort such as planting trees along roads, homes, and different institutions. Additionally, the Gram Panchayat has effectively managed a nursery, funded through MGNREGA, for tree planting etc.
- Survival rate: 90% (target 80%)
- Distribution of 6 plants per family ($350 \times 6 = 2100$)



Palle Pragathi Vanaalu

- The village park project has focused on developing 0.2 acres of land. The maintenance and tree plantation, carried out as part of the MGNREGS scheme encompasses a variety of trees such as Tekoma, Pycus, Gulmohari, tangedi, Coconut, Conocarpus, Mandara, Ganneru, Mango, Guava, Custard apple, Pannasa.



Swachh Bharat Mission(Rural)

- Open defecation free village.
- Waste segregation (Vaikuntha Dhammam)
- Centralized drainage system.

Issues

- Lack of community toilets.



Mission Bhagiratha

- Provide 135 LPCD of drinking water to every household.
- Among the various services evaluated by the villagers drinking water received the highest ranking.
- The water treatment plant is strategically positioned at the village entrance.
- Furthermore, regular cleaning of the overhead water tank on every friday is also undertaken as part of the scheme's maintenance efforts.



Nursery

- Plants has been planted in the nearby area to increase forest cover
- **Kanuga** seed is used to make biofuel.
- It has 10 beds (each bed has 1000 saplings).
- Every household is given 6 plants to increase green coverage in the village.



Sheep Rearing Scheme

- To support the traditional community the Kurumas and Yadavs.
- Eligible person is given a unit of Sheet, which has 20 Sheep and a ram.
- 26 persons beneficiaries yet, 26 persons pending.
- 31,250 Rs. Contribution by beneficiary.



Rythu Bandhu scheme

- The scheme offers a financial assistance of Rs. 5000 per acre per season to ensure that farmers have timely access to funds for purchasing agriculture necessities such as seeds, fertilizer and costs associated with preparing their farms. This initiative has yielded the following impact :-
 - 476 farmer beneficiaries
- As a result, farmers are liberated from relying on money lenders and incurring high interest loans from banks.



Rythu Bima scheme

- The main objective of the Farmers Group Life Insurance Scheme (Rythu Bima), is to provide financial relief and social security to the family members/dependents, in case of loss of farmer's life due to any reason.
- Farmers in the age group of 18 to 59 years are eligible for enroll under the scheme.
- In the event of the death of the enrolled farmer due to any cause including natural death, the insured amount of Rs.5 Lakhs.
- The entire premium is paid by the government to LIC



KCR kit

- For pregnant women.
- Pregnant women can utilize this scheme for maximum 2 deliveries, who give birth at a government hospital
- The main aim of this scheme is to provide all the necessary items for pregnant women and the newborn baby.
- Financial assistance of Rs.12,000 is provided to pregnant women in three phases .

Kalyan Lakshmi/Shadi Mubarak

- Providing financial assistance of Rs. 1,00,116 for marriage for girls(above 18 years).
- Main aim of this scheme to prevent child marriage and support marriage expense for financially distressed families.

BC Bandhu Scheme

- ➡ Financial assistance of Rs. 1 lakh to backward communities having annual income less than 1.5 lakh in rural areas.
- ➡ One beneficiary in this village works as a carpenter.

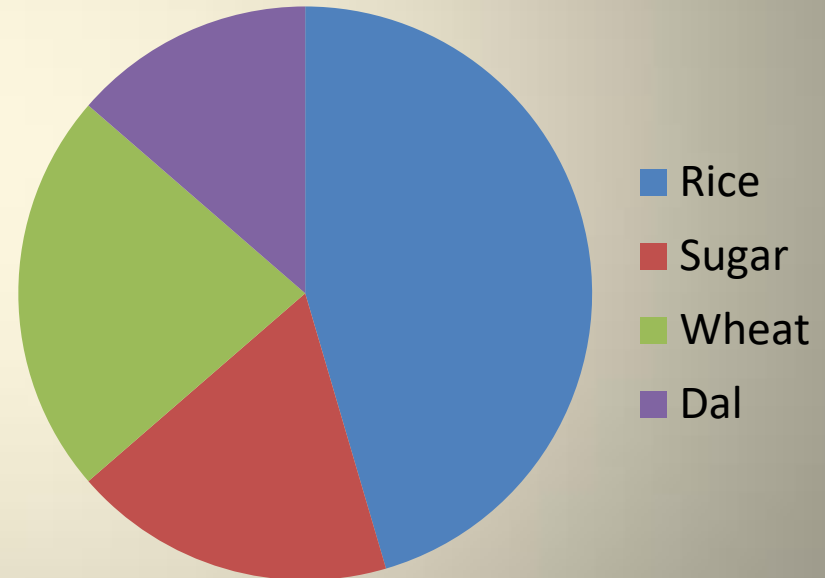
Agriculture Cooperative Society

- Farmers get support of agriculture cooperative society situated at mandal headquarters of Nagireddypet. The society provides loans and fertilizers to the farmers. However, the society being far from the village poses a challenge to farmers in terms of transport of fertilizers received by them.

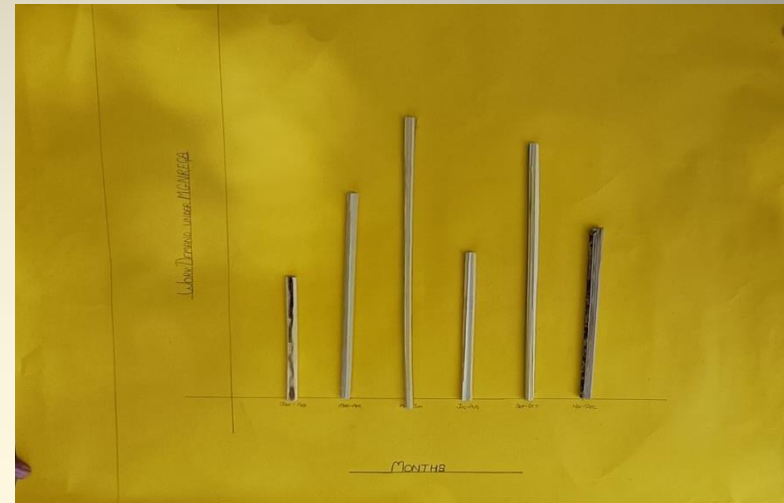
Distribution



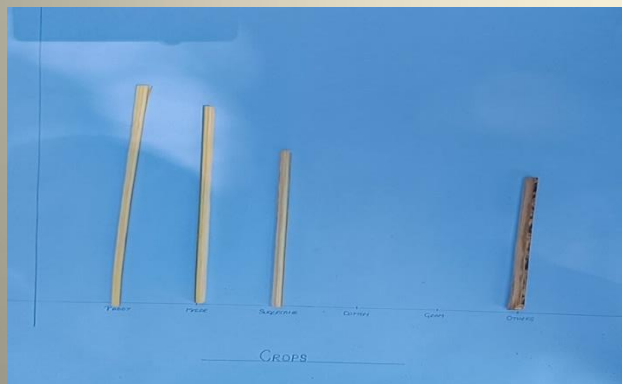
Seasonality



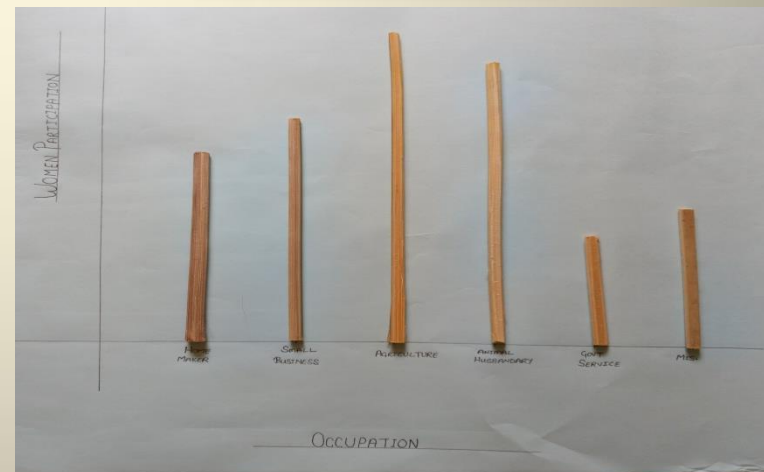
Income through Crops

- **Bathukamma** is a colourful floral festival, celebrated by womenfolk with exotic flowers of the region.
- Bathuku means life and Amma means a female names and mother.
- Bathukamma comes during the latter half of monsoon, before the onset of winter.
- As evening approaches the womenfolk dress colorfully in best of their attire and adorn lot of ornaments and place the Bathukamma in their courtyard. The women of neighborhood also gather in a large circle around it. They start singing songs by making rounds around them repeatedly, building a beautiful human circle of unity, love, sisterhood..

Major Attraction of the village

- Best Panchayat Award 2020.
- New Gram Panchayat Building built under MGNREGA.
- Gram Panchayat has its own tractor-trolley. It is used to collection and segregation of wastage.
- There are 2 Church, 2 temple and 1 mosque. People of all religions live together in the village.
- 24/7 Electricity.
- Tap water connection to every households.
- No child labour.
- Availability of water for irrigation throughout the year.
- To provide better infrastructure to Upper Primary School under **Mana Ooru-Mana Badi Scheme**.
- Conduction of Awareness Campagin & periodic Health Check-up in PHC & Anganwadi center.
- Pocharam Reservoir Lake is situated approx 8 km from the Village. Irrigation water is supplied from the reservoir through canals.

Major Issues

- Lack of accessibility to the village and bumpy roads.
- No subsidy provided on Solar installation.
- Separate building for SHGs to conduct their meetings and programs.
- No community toilets in the village.
- Although village is ODF but awareness Program should be organised frequently.
- Playground is not available in the village.
