# Introduction to Issaipet


- Machareddy Mandal
- Kamareddy District
- Distance from Kamareddy district HQ - 17 kms
- Total Area: 1526 Hectares
- No. of Houses: 754
- Total population of Gram Panchayat: (3081 Female: 1562, Male: 1519)
- SC: 624, ST: 28
- Elevation: 528m above MSL
- Main Crops: Rice, Maize and Sugarcane





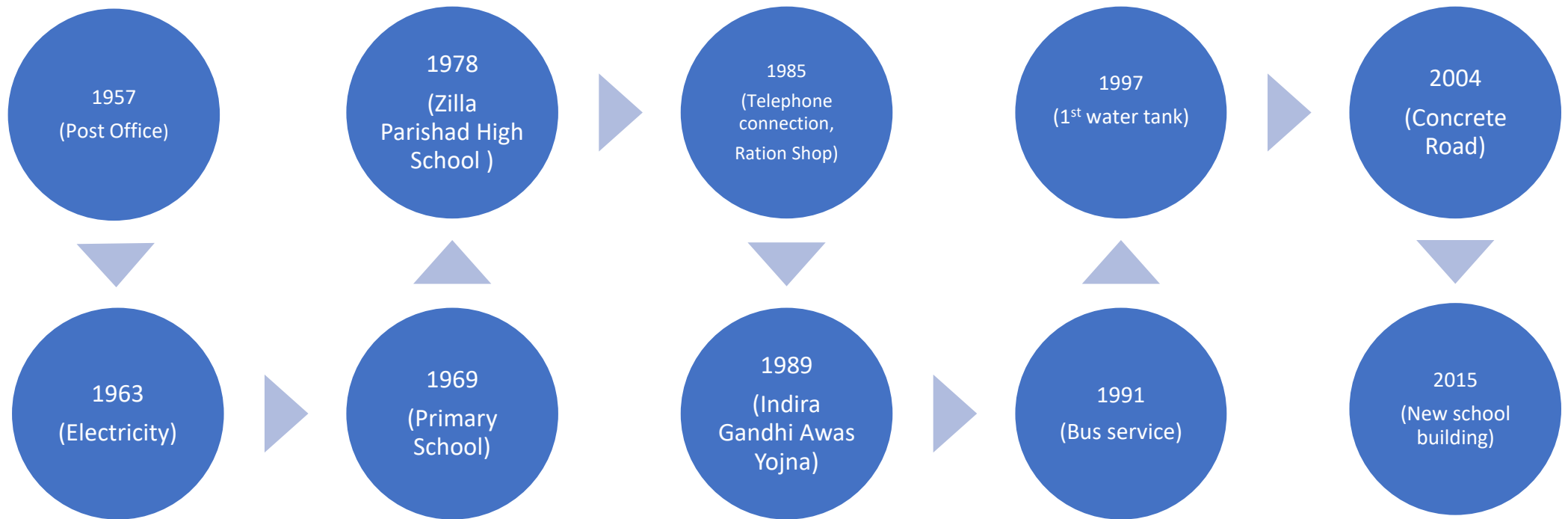
# Transect Walk



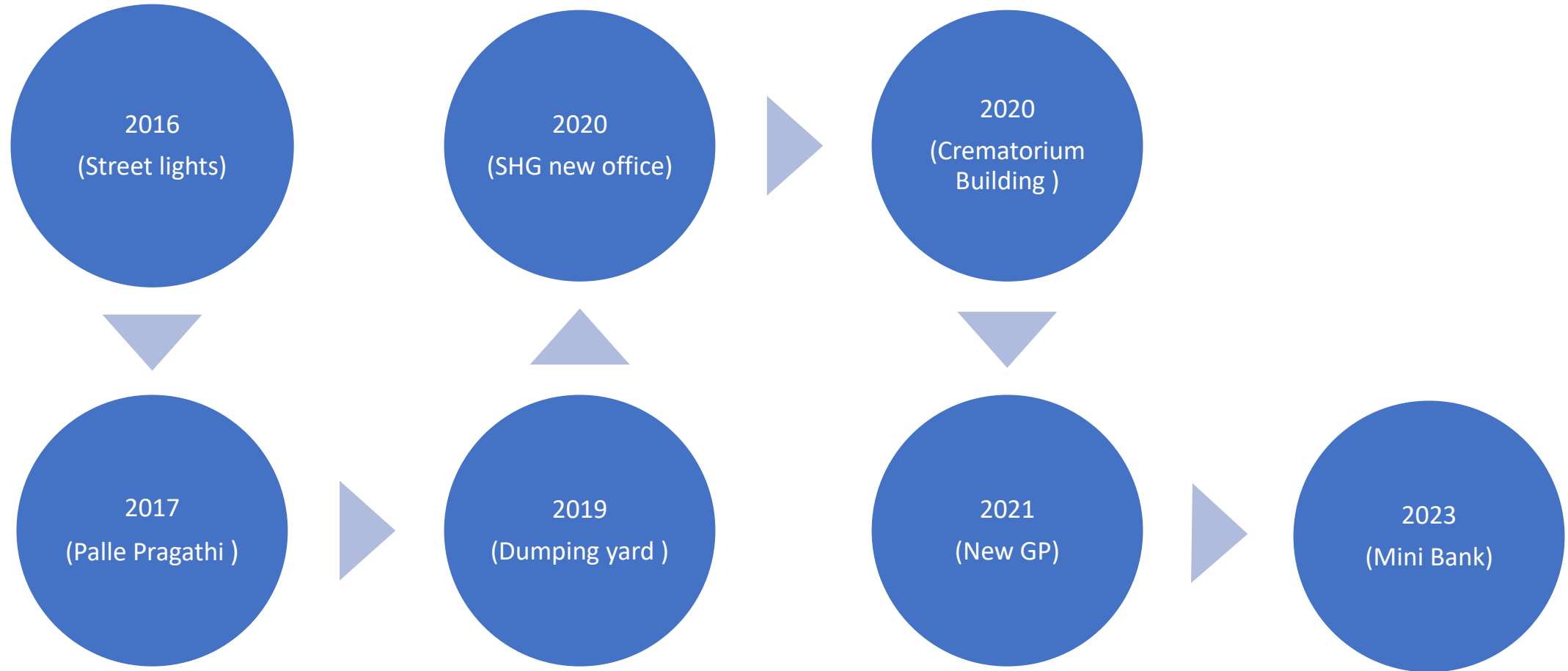
- 
- Started early at 7AM of Day 1. Covered the perimeter and interior part of the village.
  - Accompanied by villagers and elected members.
  - Main Road to electricity sub station- Crematorium- Pallavi Pragathi Vanam- Dump Yard – lakes- Paddy Fields.
  - Major portion of the village is surrounded by rice cultivation with few portion of Sugarcane.
  - People met – Farmers, Labourers, Shepherds
  - Concrete, Tar roads and Muddy roads.
  - Street lights are provided in regular intervals in the interior and perimeter area.
  - Large lake in the village called Uru Charuvu .
  - No Raythu Vedika and PACS in village.

# Visit to institutions in the village

## Primary and High School

- Established in 1978 (Primary) & 2017 (High)
- 231 students (118 boys and 113 girls)
- Staff strength: 10 teachers
- Distance of 20 m from the center of the village.
- The enrollment is mainly from BC and SC community.
- Distance of 20 m from the center of the village.
- Students can read and write English, interactive and aware.
- mid-day meal scheme properly implemented .

## Issues

- Sports facility to be created.
- Drainage was not proper inside the school campus.
- Broadband and computer facility were also not there
- Lack of availability of pure drinking water.









# Visit to institutions in the village

## PHC Sub Centre

- 2 PHC staff, 3 ASHA activist..
- Vaccination program and other health awareness initiatives conducted regularly
- ASHA activist monitoring health of pregnant women, adolescent girls and children
- First aid medical equipment and medicine available
- KCR kit and Nutrition kit properly distributed.
- Common diseases – Hypertension, Diabetes , Dengue, Malaria.
- New Building in construction Phase.

## Issues

- Running in rented facility and only one room for PHC was there.
- Less space for treatment and medical store.









# Visit to institutions in the village

## Anganwadi

- 3 Anganwadi located at different places.
- Proper meal facility for kids , egg is also given on daily basis.
- In Anganwadi centers LPG connection was there.
- Facilities for children like toys, weighing machine and instruments for creative learning.

## Issues

- No electricity connection.
- Only 1 in govt. building and other 2 in rented building.

# Visit to Institutions in the village

## Gram Panchayat

- Located at the center of the village.
- Proper drinking water facility.
- Found elected members are approachable.
- Street lighting, sanitation were available.
- House tax collection for maintenance of street lights, drainage and for library.
- Proper updation and maintenance of records
- Ample greenery around the building



## MGNREGA Nursery

- 6 plants given to every house hold in the village free of cost.
- Nursery maintained to increase green cover.
- Regular monitoring of planted saplings.





# Sub-Post office

- Established around 1990s.
- AASARA pension scheme- Elderly people in the village queue up at the post office to claim their pension.
- Step towards financial inclusion.

## Issues

- Running in a rented facility.
- Network and computer facility not there.

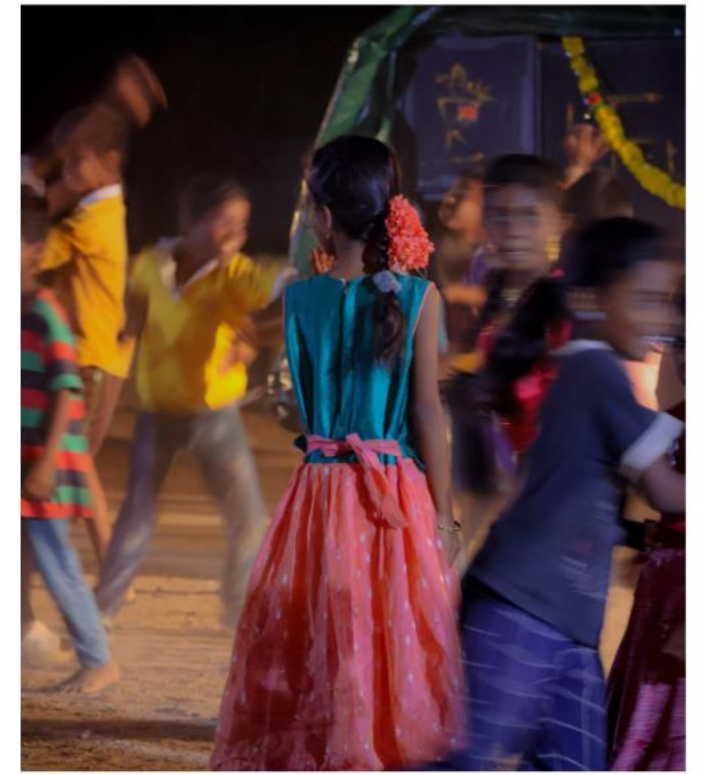


# Self Help Group

- Total 81 groups – 79 active , 2 inactive
- Participant-women.
- Basically the purpose of the Group is to provide the loan from bank to support the family for agriculture and other small scale businesses.
- Maximum amount of loan is 10 lakh for each group and loan recovered within 32 months.
- Security for Loan- husband and son.
- Benefit of loan under this scheme
  - Removed third party.
  - Small interest rate.
  - Load distributed loan.
  - Pay on monthly basis.







## Bathukamma Celebration

The word 'Bathukamma' means 'Mother Goddess Come Back to Life'. It is celebrated to thank and worship Goddess Parvati for the abundance of crops. The seasonal flowers of spring are arranged on a square bamboo frame or square wooden plank with the size of frames that is hardly tapering off to directly form a pinnacle on top. It looks like the shape of a temple tower or 'Gopuram'. On top of the flowers, a lump of turmeric is kept. It is a time of joy for everyone, especially for the womenfolk.



# Dumping Yard

- It is situated outside habitation.
- Solid waste not segregated into categories such as plastic bottles, glass bottles, paper etc.
- No tanks for operation.
- Payment of workers is provided through MGNREGS.
- The revenue generated by disposal of waste is utilized for village development activities.

## Resource mapping

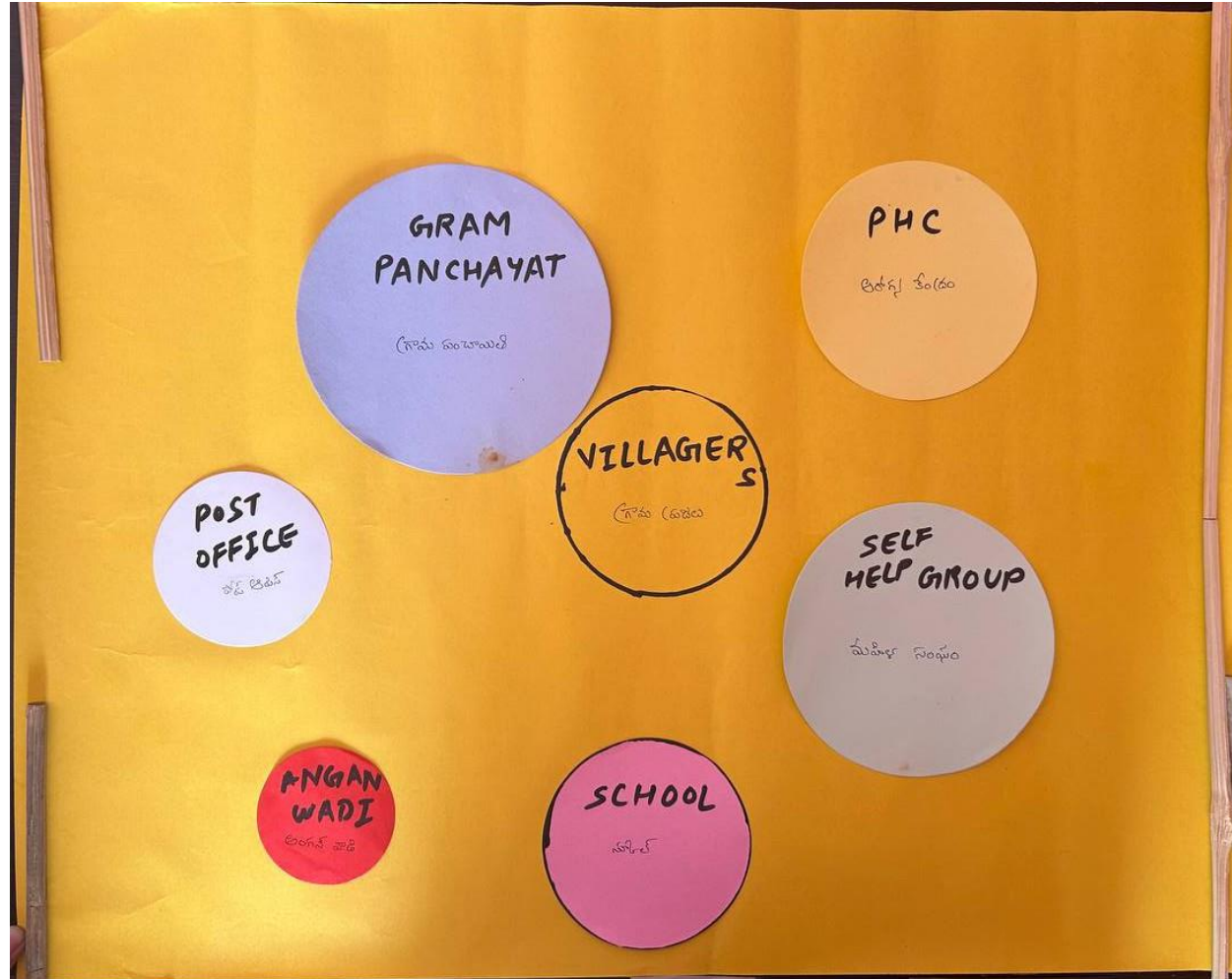
- Effective participation of village people and school students in drawing the map.

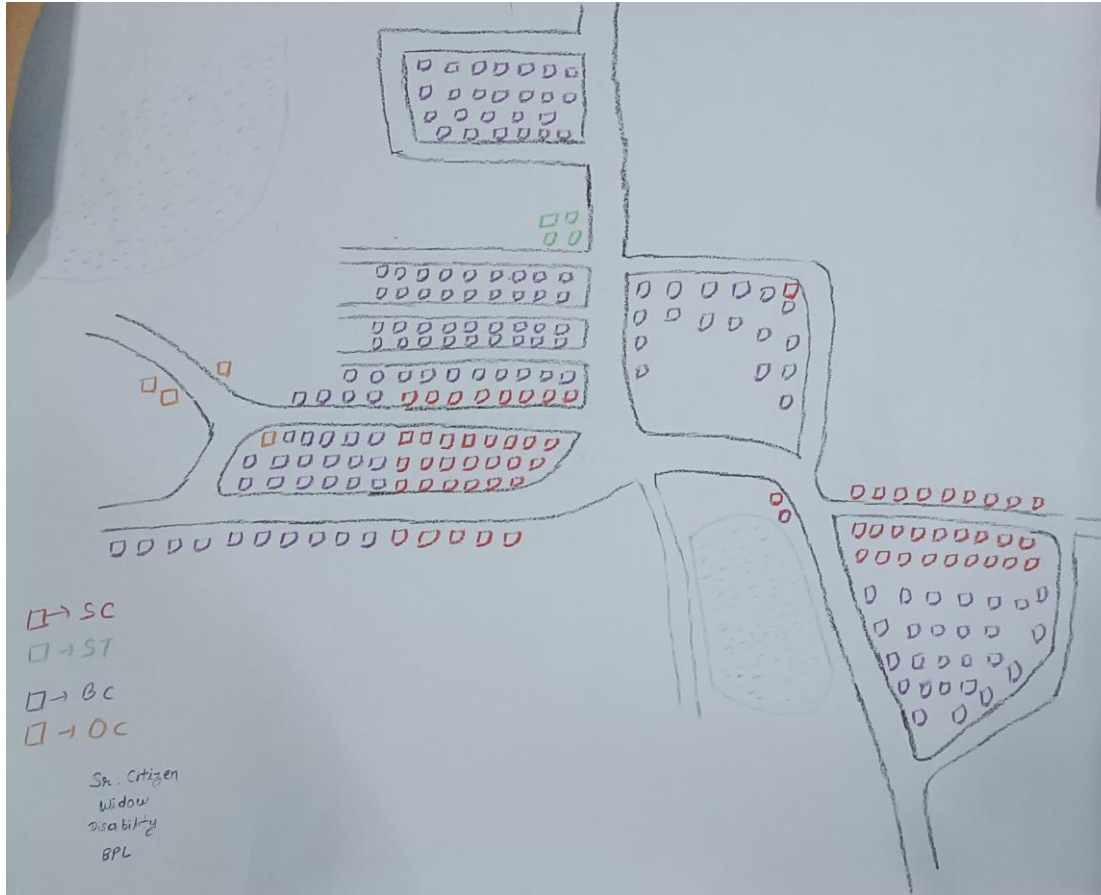


# Social Mapping

# Seasonality

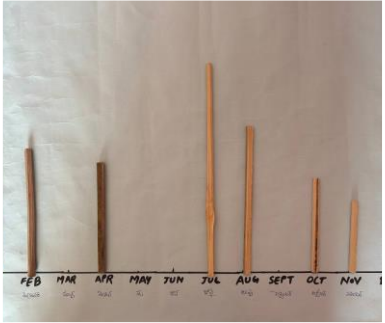
- Conducted at GP and SHG centre .

## Methodology

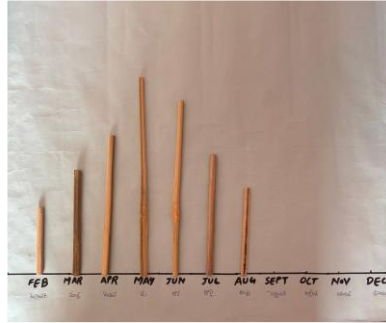
- Sticks of different lengths provided.

  - Agriculture Employment



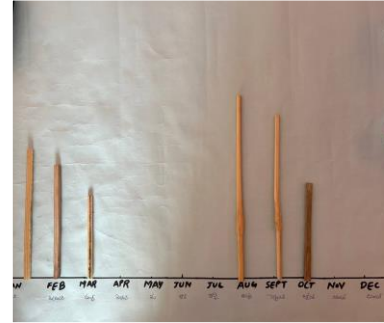

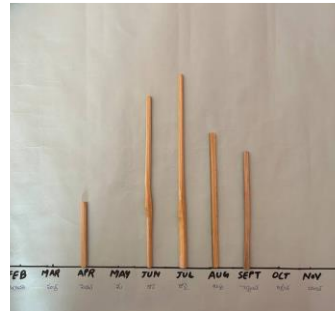
Employment

Rainfall

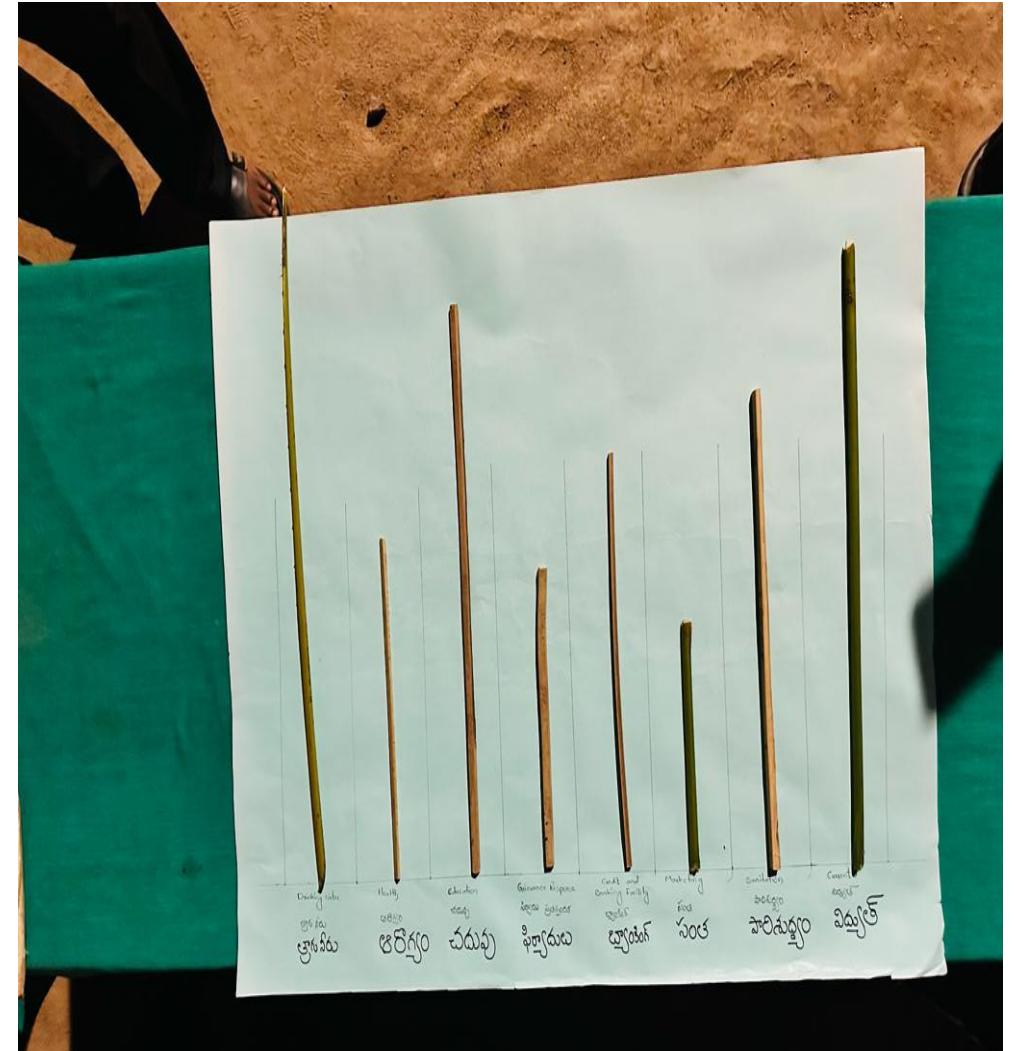




# Aspirational Ranking Matrix

# Review of Schemes

## **MGNREGS**

- 1052 cards registered
- No progressive work under MGNREGA in this financial year due to lesser demand and lack of funding.

Following works are included under this scheme :-

- Magic Soak pits construction and its maintenance by each household
- Plantation under Telangana Ku Haritha Haaram scheme
- Crematorium facility under Vaikuntha Dhaaram scheme
- Village Park under Palle Pragathi Vanaalu scheme

## **Mission Kakatiya**

- Desiltation of lakes/ waterbodies and renovation of tanks

## **Telangana Ku Haritha Haaram**

- The scheme's goal is to raise the existing green cover from 24% to 33%.
- Currently, the village boast a green cover, their diverse effort such as planting trees along roads, homes, and different institutions. Additionally, the Gram Panchayat has effectively managed a nursery, funded through MGNREGA, for tree planting etc.





# Review of Schemes

## Vaikuntha Dhaamam

- The initiative seeks to establish a respectful place for “final resting place” for people to cremate their near and dear ones.
- MGNREGS funds were utilized to create two cremation platforms.
- Far from village.
- The crematorium area lacked dustbins and drinking water facilities.

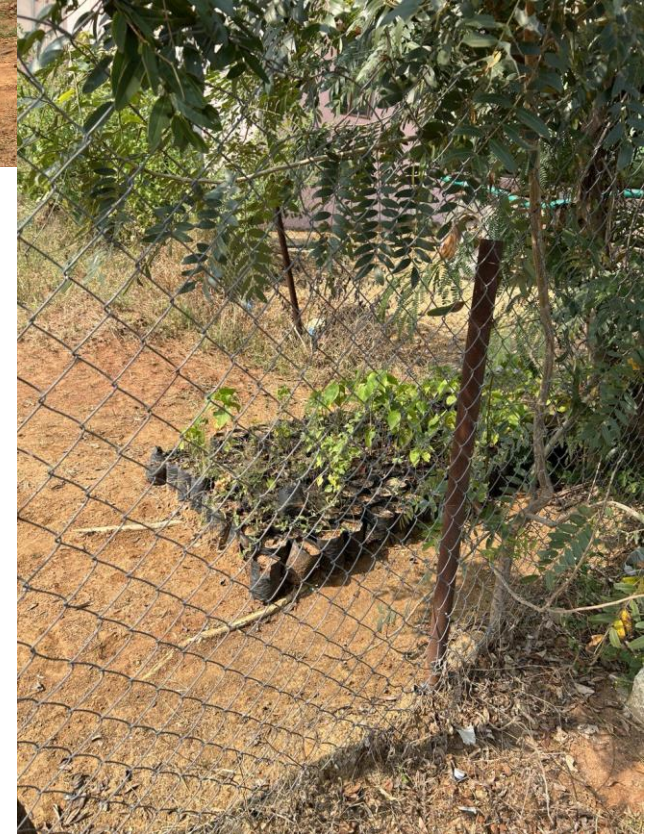




# Review of Schemes

## Palle Pragathi Vanaalu

The maintenance and tree plantation, carried out as part of the MGNREGS scheme encompasses a variety of trees such as Tekoma, Pycus, Gulmohari, tangedi, Coconut, Conocorpus, Mandara, Ganneru, Mango, Guava, Pannasa.





# Review of Schemes

## **Mission Bhageeratha**

- Primary objective – 100 LPCD of drinking water to every household for rural areas.
- Tap connection to every household.
- 4 Overhead water tank properly working and maintained.
- The water treatment plant is strategically positioned at the village center.
- Furthermore, regular cleaning of the overhead water tank is also undertaken as part of the scheme's maintenance efforts.

## **Rythu Bandhu (Input subsidy) scheme**

- The scheme offers a financial assistance of Rs. 5000 per acre per farmer each season to ensure that farmers have timely access to funds for purchasing agriculture necessities such as seeds, fertilizer and costs associated with preparing their farms.
- As a result, farmers are liberated from relying on money lenders and incurring high interest loans from banks.





# Review of Schemes

## Swachh Bharat Mission

- Each household and institution is equipped with toilets.
- A dedicated vehicle is employed for daily garbage collection.
- Segregation facility is not established to classify biodegradable and non - biodegradable waste.



# Review of Schemes

## Sheep Rearing Scheme

- 119 Families benefitted
- mostly from Kurma & Golla community
- 175000 Rs./Unit provided for 30 Female and 1 male sheep





# Review of Schemes

- Kalyana Lakshmi / Shaadi Mubarak
  - Financial support for girl child's wedding at/after marriage age to reduce financial burden of the family.
  - Financial aid of Rs. 1,00,116 is provided for low income group families.
  - About 100+ beneficiaries in village.

# Issaipet village - Development

- Major part of the village is covered by concrete & tar roads.
- 24/7 electricity.
- Tap connection to every household and drinking water available.
- No child labour.
- 60% Literacy.
- Garbage collection but no proper segregation.
- IMR and MMR at 0%.
- Construction of individual household latrines.
- Community Centre and temple's built with philanthropic activities including villagers.

## Agriculture

- Uru Cheravu lake developed under mission Kakatiya
- Availability of water for irrigation throughout the year.
- Supplementary income from Tadi and Beedi for farmers.





# Issaipet village – Action Plan

- To provide better infrastructure to primary and high school under scheme .
- Beneficiaries for two-bedroom schemes to be identified and given priority in the next allocation
- Play ground in the secondary school and encourage students in extra circular activities
- Usage of solar-powered street lights
- Proper drainage facility and roads in the SC/ST community area
- To reduce the menace of monkeys, langur posters to be kept in prime areas and to monitor the movement of monkeys
- Conduction of periodic health checkups in schools and awareness campaign
- Lack of skill training centres and awareness programmes for youth.
