

# **SCHOOL**

> 2 Schools

 1 Primary School - 130 Students, Girls- 62, Bøys- 68, 5 Teachers

• /1 High School – 133 Students, Girls- 63, Boys-70, 8 Teachers

- > /60% SC/ST Students
- Average Attendance 80%
- Parents-Teachers Meeting held every month to discuss a child's learning and progress.
- School has 1 Science Laboratory.

## Anganwadi

- 2 Anganwadi Centres 1 Main Centre, 1 Mini Centre (majority includes SC Children).
- > Total Enrolment 97
- 0-3 years age 82, 3-5 years age 15
- Weight monitoring program is organized every month for children of age 0-5 years, pregnant women and lactating mothers.
- Every children is monitored through an application called NHTS (Nutrition and Health Training System). All children were found to be healthy except 1 child.









## **Special Mention**

- An Anganwadi worker, Ayesha, was awarded with the Best Anganwadi Worker of the district in 2014 for her dedicated service.
- She is serving as AWW for nearly 20 years in the main Anganwadi centre of the village.




### Issues

- Less Extra-curricular activities in high school due to heavy academic pressure.
- > Lack of equipment in lab.
- Water supply to toilets was not available to children in the main Anganwadi centre. They have to use the ones attached to the high school.
- Clean drinking water was not available in the Anganwadi centre. Children need to bring their own water.
- > Poor maintenance of Libraries.

### **Health Sub Centre**

- Health Subcentre with 1 ANM and 2 Aasha workers.
- Disease profile Hypertension, Diabetes and Typhoid
- > PHC (Chandurthi) is 8 Km away from the Village.
- Ambulance service is available from the Mandal PHC.
- Vaccination program is organised every Wednesday for children and pregnant women.
- > Awareness Program is organised every month on Child nutrition and cancer
- To control increasing cases of Hypertention and Diabetes monthly checkup is conducted for people above 30 years of age under the NCD Programme.
- > 100% institutional Delivery
- One Private medical shop





## **PDS Ration Shop**

Two types of cards

AFSC Cards (for below BPL families) - 27 cards (35 Kgs rice per card)

FSC Cards (for BPL families) - 640 cards (6 Kgs rice per unit)

- Total storage capacity 150 Quintal.
- Provides food security and reduce food expenditure burden on BPL families.

Issues -

People raised concern about the quality of food grains.

PDS shop provides rice only.





# Venn Diagram






# Seasonality

# Agriculture

- Agriculture is major occupation( around 75% population involved)
- Marginal farmers- 636, small farmers- 342
- > Total cultivated area- 2850 acres
- Major crops- paddy( around 1500 acres), Cotton- ( around 600 acres)

Others crops are Bengal gram and maize

- Total irrigated land- 250 acres
- Major sources of irrigation-borewells, openwells
- Rainfall- 900mm Issues-
- Monoculture of Paddy crop in Both Rabi and Kharif Seasons
- Lack of Diversification of crops





### Farmer's Welfare Schemes

## Rythu Bandhu



- Providing Investment Support Agriculture and Horticulture crops by way of grant of Rs. 5,000/- per acre per farmer each season for purchase of inputs like Seeds, Fertilizers, Pesticides, Labour.
- Coverage- 1224 Farmers availing benefit amounting 1.42 crores

#### Impact -


All the covered farmers are availing timely money to buy inputs, avoiding credit from money lenders.

## Rythu Bima



- Cover's the life of farmer's family in the event of his/her demise through payment of RS. 5 Lakh to the nominee.
- Coverage 847 farmers are enrolled and 11 claims till now.
- Impact-

Provides financial relief and social security to the family members in case of farmer's loss of life, especially benefitting small and marginal farmers.











### **MGNREGS**

- Total Jøb Cards 501
- Total no. of workers 985 (Significant Pop.)
- Active Job Cards 325
- ► Active Workers 520
- Average days of employment 100
- Average Wage Rate Rs. 245 but for FY24 Avg. wage rate notified by Govt. for Telangana is Rs. 272
- Payment of wages usually done within 10 days.
- Capturing of attendance through NMMS (National Mobile Monitoring System)
- Works under the scheme includes feeder channels, nursery raising, plantation under Telangana ku Haritha Haaram scheme.



### Issues

- Demand and supply of Unskilled Manual Work is not uniform, on an Avg. there is less demand of work.
- Wage Rate notified by the government for Telangana is Rs. 272 but the workers are getting Rs. 245 because they are doing less measured work than what is required.
  - This negates the effect of wage rate revision increment recently done by the Government.

## Telangana Ku Haritha Haaram

- A flagship programme of the Telangana Government to increase the present 24% tree cover in the State to 33% of the total geographical area of the State.
- Total saplings planted in the village 48000
- Survival percentage 90 %.
- Impact –

reduction in pollution levels

lowering in climate temperature.

increase in wild resourses



### Vaikuntha Dhaamam

- This scheme aims to built a dignified place for last rites for villagers to cremate their dear ones.
- Status- Presence of well-maintained crematorium with all the required facilities like running water and electricity.



## Palle Pragathi Vanaalu

- Scheme envisions to build a Park in every village for community gatherings and physical activities.
- Achieving twin objectives of increasing green cover and improving sanitation in villages.
- In this village, compost shed, dumping yard and Nursery are also built for sanitation management.
- Status- The park is not well maintained.
- **Usage** Due to its long distance from the main village settlement, the park is less used by the villagers.

### **Swachh Bharat Mission**

- Under SBM, the village has achieved ODF+ status last year.
- 100% coverage of House Hold Latrines
- Overall the sanitary status of the village is excellent with clean concrete roads and sock pit drainage system, thus having zero open flowing nalaas.
- Various village cleaning drives are being held with mottos and hoardings all over the village to promote cleanliness.









## **Special Initiatives**

### DRY DAY(FRIDAY)

- Weekly Dry Day (Friday), an initiative to prevent dengue, malaria and other vector-borne diseases.
- In this, ASHA workers go to each households & schools to disinfect tanks and other possible larva growth sources.



## DRINKING WATER PURIFIER

- A german based NGO, SEWS had setup a drinking water purifier for the villagers that operates through a rechargeable card.
- Affordable rates @ Rs. 5 for 20 litres.
