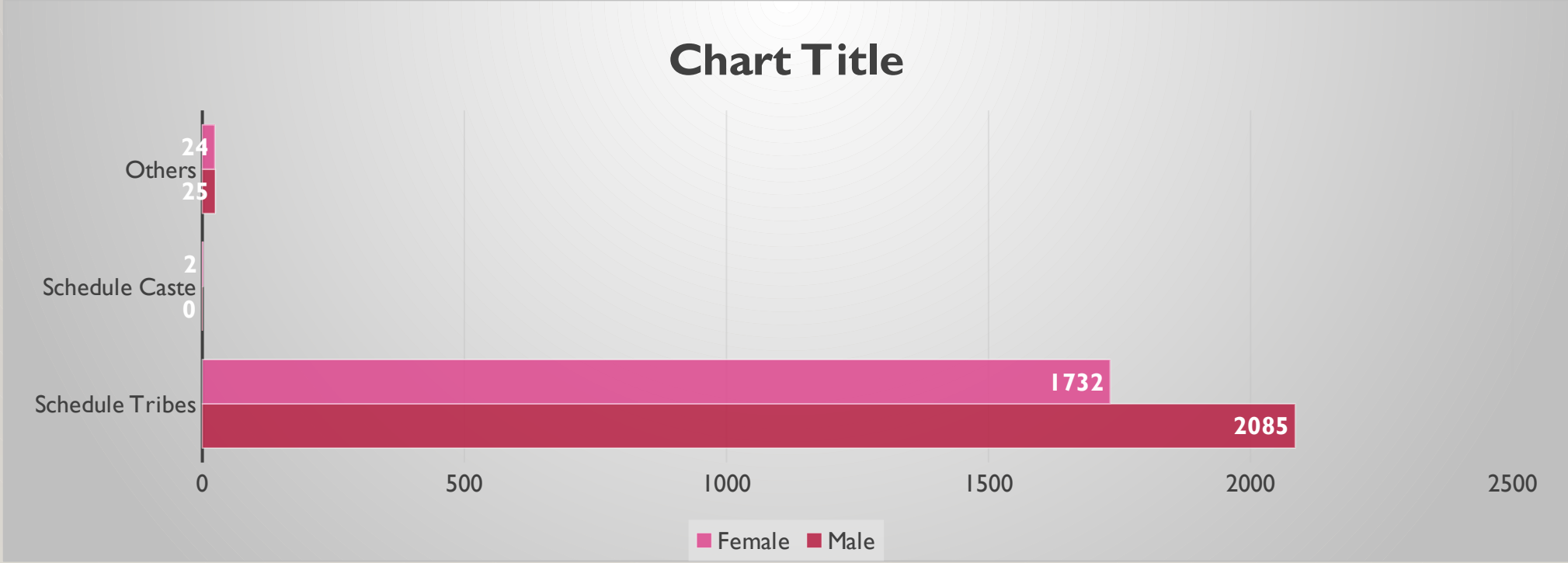

POPULATION DISTRIBUTION

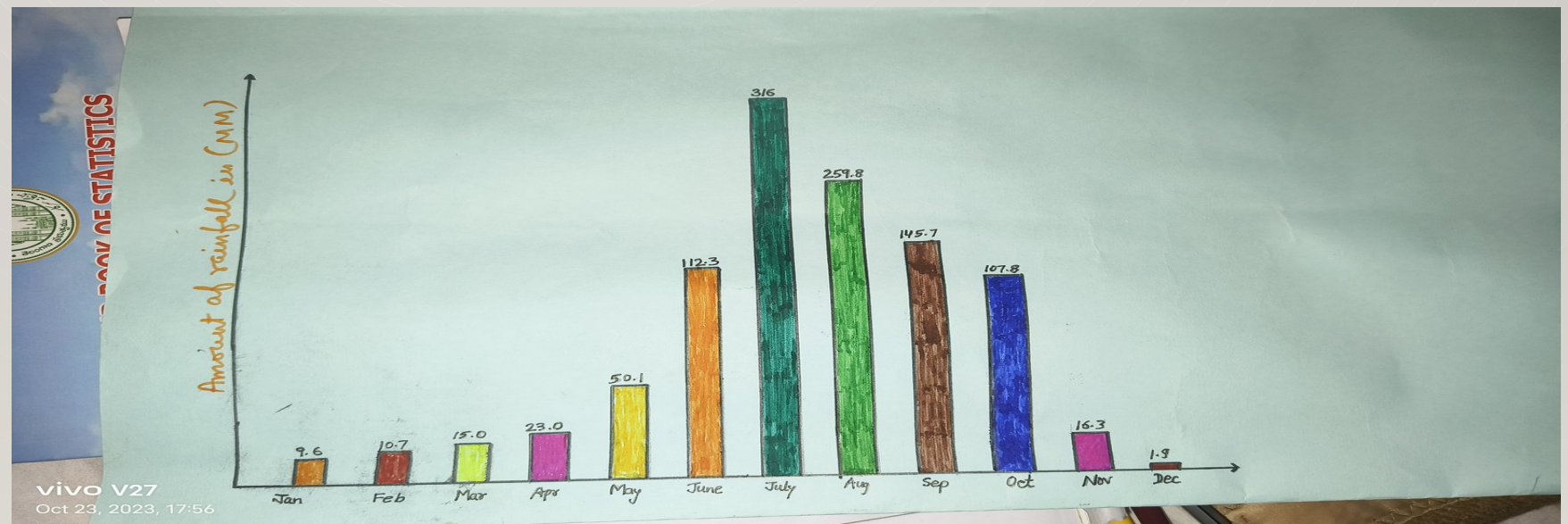


TRANSECT WALK

EDUCATION

 2. Lack of playground for Sports activities and sports Items
- Perception and Attitude towards Education is very good
 1. Parents allows their children to go school
 2. Students are eager to learn new things.

ISSUES

- No. of student is not increasing.
- Guardian of students are not satisfied with the education provided in Primary Schools hence many of them are gradually shifting their children in Private Schools.
- There is lack of teachers hence one teacher teaches many subjects and many classes simultaneously.
- Lack of sanitation in School.
- Toilets are also not clean.

WAY FORWARD

- No. of teachers needs to be increased.
- Measures need to be taken to increase the belief of guardian in Government School education to which they send their child in school.
- Students should be motivated to go school.

 1. ANM Room for vaccine to children
 2. Dr. Room for patient
 3. Pregnant women check up rooms
 4. Hall for visitors

Health

- Most common diseases: Anemia, Pneumonia in children, Hypertension, Diabetes and Malnutrition

Problems

- First Aid kits stocks is not available
- During emergency in night no one is available
- No treatment for dog bite, snake bite
- Instruments like weight measuring machine is not accurate
- Not properly check for Fever
- Lack of necessary equipment
- No refrigerator to keep medicine and vaccine at needed temperature.

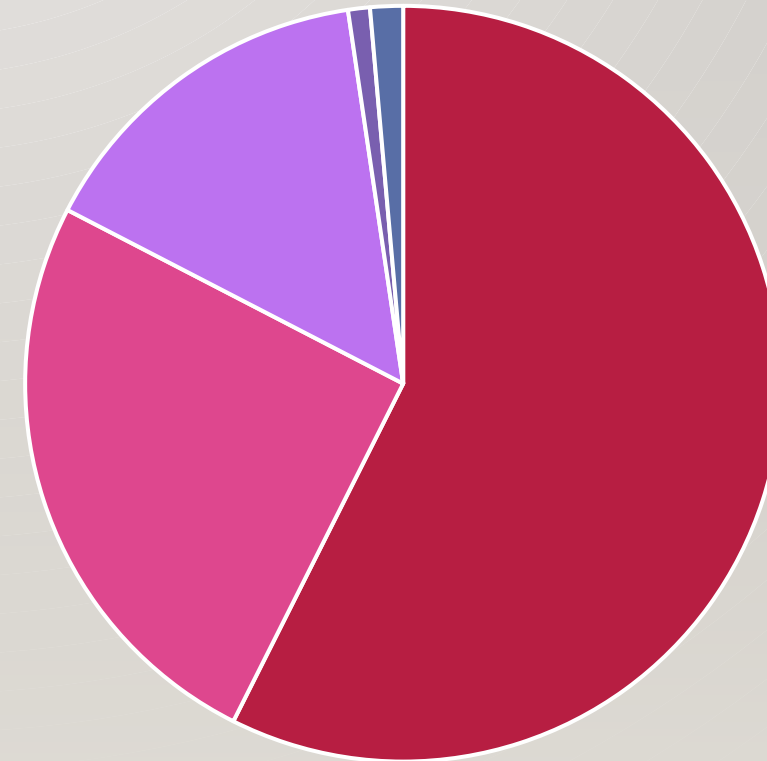

AGRICULTURE

- **Schemes:-**

- **(a) Rythu Bandhu:** - 5000/- per acre per person in one season
(Annually get 10,000/- per acre)

Limitation:

For Tenant Farmers

1. They are not covered under this scheme.
2. They are not provided with any type of agricultural subsidies (eg. Subsidies on compost, manure and seeds)

- **Schemes:-**
- **(b) Rythu Bima: -**
 - 5 lakh death cover for a person age 18-59 year
 - Maximum age to avail this benefit : 59 years

MGNREGS

- Provide atleast 100 days wage employment.
 - Each person provide 272rs. Per day wage.
 - Total No. of Job Cards issued: 1,325
 - Total No. of Active job Cards: 600
1. SC worker against active workers – 0.63%

VAIKUNTHA DHAMMAM

Objectives:

- Dignified place for last rites
- Ecologically pleasant place

Ground Level Report:

- Village people use own site for cremation (Because of their sentiments)
- There is a place for cremation but used by less people.
- Not maintained properly

VAIKUNTHA DHAMMAM



SWACHCH BHARAT MISSION

Objectives:

- Open defecation free status
- Provision of household latrine
- Overall cleanliness

Ground Level Report:

- No open defecation, all houses have latrine inside the premises of house.
- Alternate day garbage truck to collect garbage
- Village is very clean
- Every household has Magic soak pit which treats water before it recharges the ground water
- Kitchen Garden is found in many household, in which the waste water of kitchen irrigates the plant of Kitchen Garden
- Steps are being taken to reduce the use of plastic bags and single use plastic
- Twin Pit toilet tanks have replaced single pit tanks

PENSION SCHEME

Objectives:

- Provide Economic Support

Ground Level Report:

Social Security pension (Aasra Pension)

- Pensions for Widow = 2,000 Rs (Now 3000/-)
- Pensions for Old age = 2,000 Rs (Now 3000/-)
- Pensions for Disable = 4,000 Rs

Note: No new registration due to problem on the website for 1 years

KALYANA LAKSHMI/SHADI MUBARAK

Objectives:

- Provide financial support for girl child's wedding at/after marriageable age
- Reduce borrowings by family
- Rs.1,00,116/- assistance, for low income families

Ground Level Report:

After marriage the money will be credited into the account.

Reduce pressure from bride side

MISSION BHAGEERATHA

Objectives:

- Provide piped drinking water to each house hold Coverage
- 100 LPCD Quantity of water provided
- Avoid community taps and wastage

Ground Level Report:

All people not get benefit of this scheme, These Tanks are not connected to each households so they have to get water from motors (if this motor is not working the people do not get water for 3-4 days, No other source for water is available nearby)

MISSION BHAGEERATHA



GRUHA LAXMI SCHEME

Objectives:

- To provide the Pakka House to eligible people
- Under this scheme 3 lacs rupees is provided in three installments
 1. 1 lacs rs is given when basement is completed
 2. 1 lacs rs is given when the construction of structure of house is completed
 3. 1 lacs rs is given when the house is completed.

Ground Level Report:

Many of the eligible people did not get benefit of this scheme

Many who are not eligible as per their good financial status got benefitted under this scheme.



RYTHU VEDIKA

- Place for farmers' training meetings.

Findings on ground level.

- One building for a cluster i.e. for a group of villages hence very far from many villages. Hence, the building is far from Bhagyanagar Thanda Village.
- As per agriculture extension officer a very few farmers visit there.
- On conversation with farmers, they told that they don't visit there because they are not called to attend such meeting or training.



OTHER SCHEMES

- Sheep Rearing Scheme

Sheep Rearing activity is mainly attached to the people belonging to “Yadav” cast and this cast is not present in this village hence there is no beneficiary under this scheme.

- Dalitha Bandhu

People of Scheduled Caste (for whom this scheme is meant) not benefited by this scheme.
