MAOIST MOVEMENT: TRENDS AND IMPLICATIONS

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INTRODUCTION

- ➤ CPI (Maoist) founded September 21, 2004
- Objective: Capture political / State power through PPW
- Leaders: Ganapathy, Kishanda, Nambala
- > Strength: Estimated 6,500 UG; CC 20 (11 from TS 3; from AP)
- Spatial spread: 106 districts, 10 states; core 35 districts (157 dts just three years ago)



MERGER AND CONSOLIDATION

- CPI-Maoist formed with the merger of CPI-ML (PW) and MCCI on September 21, 2004
- >PW, PU merger in 1998
- >RCCI, MCC merger in January 2003
- > CPI-ML (Naxalbari) and MUC and Red Flag merged
- >MUC formed in 1997 is an amalgam of



MERGER AND CONSOLIDATION

- Naxalites of Kerala Communist Party and Maharashtra Communist Party merged
- CPI-ML (Naxalbari) and MUC merged April 1999. Later Red Flag faction merged with Naxalbari
- ➤ Naxalbari merged with CPI (Maoist) in April 2008
- Janasakthi Kerala Unit. Strong possibility of other units, too, merging

TACTICAL UNITED FRONT

- > Secret Committee; functions under SUCOMO
- Idea dates back to 1995 when the then PW seriously considered forming UF
- Delay in plan following the 1998 merger with Party Unity
- ➤ In 2002, concrete shape;



TUF: UTILITY

- Poach partners for potential leaders and ideologues;
- Serve as a good cover from the long arm of the state;
- Essentially being a political activity, it reinforces the military activities, i.e. armed struggle

- >RDF an amalgam of SFPR and AIPRF
- ► CAVOW Salwa Judum Arundhati Roy
- ➤PDFI Founded in July 2006; Vara Vara Rao, Kalyan Rao, Darshan Pal, Medha Patkar, Nandita Haksar, SAR Geelani, BD Sarma
- ►In 2004, MR 2004; Narayan Sanyal alias Naveen Prasad



TUI

►UF with Muslims

- SIMI ban Azad: "It was a reiteration of the (government's) policy to continue it's brutal war on Muslims"
- Fight alongside terrorists in J&K
- 9th Congress: "The Indian state too has targeted Muslims, branding them 'terrorist'. After the 9/11 incident and the Parliament Attack Case Muslims were targeted once again... Indian state forces are even capturing and annihilating innocent Muslims now and then, in the name of nabbing terrorists"
- Azam Ghori; Akkiraju on Hiren Pandya murder accused



URBAN MOVEMENT

- From an operational point of view Urban Areas are safe to operate. "Because of the anonymity it accords, it becomes easy for the Maoists to stay and operate in urban centres"
- Urban Perspective Plan discussed at 9th Congress; finalised September 2007

WAY FORWARD

- > Security, Development, Rights of Local Communities and PPM
- ➤ Additional Central Assistance (earlier IAP)
- > Rs 5280 Cr for Fiscal 2013-15
- Largely military-oriented
- > Area-specific strategies needed
- > Just about picking-up; 3-5 years; 7-10 years



CHANGES

- Exploitation; Tenancy; Land Relations; Landlord class; Political empowerment; Rural loans; Money Lenders
- Improvement in Literacy, medical facilities, transportation, information revolution, road connectivity,...
- Political empowerment; Caste assertion; Identity politics;



CHANGE IN STRATEGY

- "Semi-feudal relations are affected, we have to make antiimperialist, capitalist struggle PRIMARY and anti-feudal struggle SECONDARY" – Social Investigation of WGL
- GOI admits: Active support to people's movement against proposed Bauxite mining in Niyamgiri hills (Rayagada and Kalahandi of OR) and Agency areas of Vizag in AP) and Polavaram dam issue in WG of AP
- Consolidation in existing areas;
- Base on tri-junction of Kerala, Karnataka and Tamil Nadu

2.88 Action Plan: In order to holistically address the LWE problem in an effective manner, Government has formulated National Policy and Action Plan adopting four pronged strategy in the areas of security, development, ensuring rights & entitlement of local communities and management of public perception. The focus of the Government is to address security, development and governance deficits in 106 LWE affected district especially in the 35 most affected LWE districts spread in 7 States.
