

What is Kalbelia Dance?

- ✓ Kalbelia, the snake dance from the state
 of Rajasthan is a piece of art performed
 by the Kalbelia tribe and hence is its
 name.
- ✓ The word Kalbelia is a blend of two words which are 'Kal' and 'Belia'. The word 'Kal' means snake and 'Belia' means friends and hence the word all together means Snakes friend.



HISTORY

- The Kalbelia Dance marks a joyful event and is a vital part of the Kalbelia culture.
- Kalbelia community is the nomadic tribe of Rajasthan.
- Their occupation of trading snake venom and catching snake has bestowed them with the title of Jogira, Sapera or Jogi.
- Earlier, the Kalbelia men used to carry cobras in cane baskets and move from door to door.
- Their women however, used to accompany them while dancing, singing and earning a livelihood from their beautiful performances.
- It was from there that the Kalbelia Dance came into picture. The sensuous form of dancing mimics the movements of snakes in some ways.



- One of the most well known aspect of kalbelia tribe is their experties as snake charmer and snake catchers.
- This connection to snakes can be seen in the Kalbelia dance as the costume as well as dance movements resemble the movements made by serpents.
- After the wildlife act 1972 the Kalbelia's have been pushed out of there ancestral occupation of snake handling. The Kalbelia dance now a key source of income for them.



FEATURES

UNIQUE ASPECT OF THE KALBELIA DANCE IS THAT IT IS ONLY PERFORMED BY THE WOMEN WHILE THE MEN **PLAY THE** INSTRUMENTS.



• COSTUME :-

- THE UPPER BODY CLOTH IS CALLED ANGRAKHI AND A PIECE OF CLOTH WORN ON HEAD KNOWN AS ODHANI SIMILARLY THE LOWER BODY CLOTH IS CALLED LEHENGA.
- ALL THESE CLOTHES ARE MIXED IN RED AND BLACK HUES AND EMBROIDERED IN SUCH A WAY THAT WHEN THESE DANCERS PERFORM, THEIR CLOTHES REPRESENT A COMBINATION OF COLOURS SOOTHING TO EYES AS WELL AS TO THE ATMOSPHERE.



DANCING STYLE

- ✓ The women dance in circles with a pair in centre who entertains the mob with swift movements of their body but with their head covered under veil.
- ✓ Slowly and smoothly every pair performs and merges into the circle for another pair to perform or please the gathering. The ladies move their body in an acrobatic manner or even much smoother than that
