

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF DISTRICT

- Named after the ruler of Bijapur, Ali Adil Shah
- Comprises of 18 Mandals and 508 villages; ; gateway district to South and Central India
- 2 revenue divisions 1) Adilabad 2) Utnoor
- ☐ The important river that flow through the district is Penganga
- The climate of the district is characterized by hot summer and in generally dry except during the south-west monsoon season.
- Red and black soil are both found in Adilabad district though black soil predominates, accounting for almost 72%
- □ The district comprises an area of 4,153 square kilometres (1,603 sq mi).with a density of population of 170 persons per sq.km
- 2 Assembly Constituencies: Adilabad & Boath (ST)
- ☐ The literacy rate of the district is 63.46% as against 66.54% of the state literacy rate. The sex ratio of the district is 989 females per 1000 males as against 988 of the state

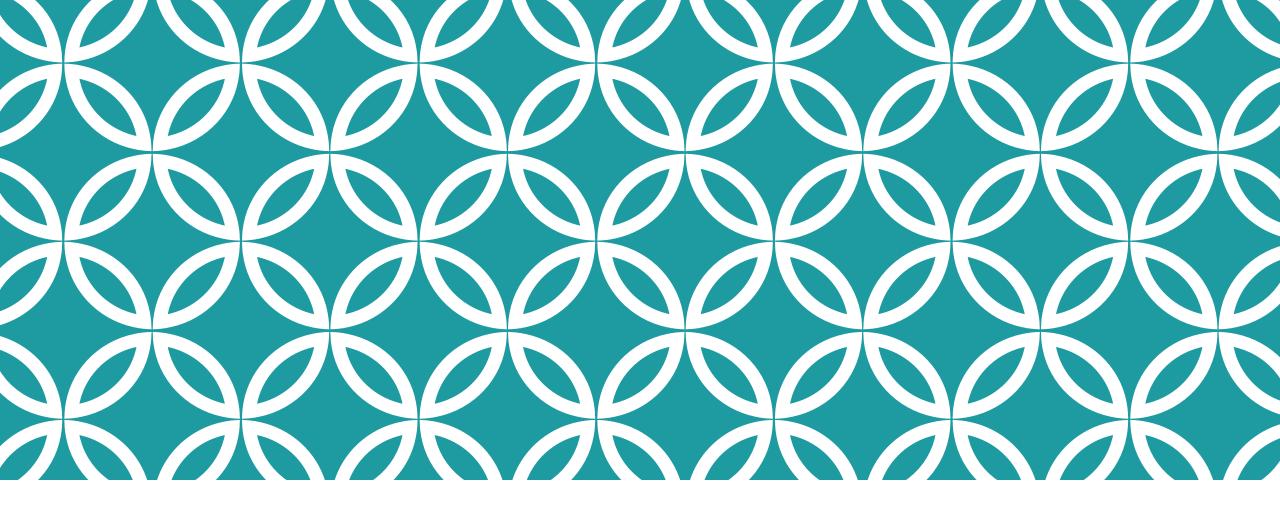




■Work Profile

Out of total population, 867 were engaged in work activities. 96.42 % of workers describe their work as Main Work (Employment or Earning more than 6 Months) while 3.58 % were involved in Marginal activity providing livelihood for less than 6 months. Of 867 workers engaged in Main Work, 473 were cultivators (owner or co-owner) while 225 were Agricultural labourers.

- the most peripheral and first point of contact between the primary health care system and the community
- O1 **Unani** Practitioner, O1 Auxiliary Nurse Midwife (ANM), O1 Nurse
- □Antenatal care provided; referred to Mandal PHC in case of emergency (at 7 km distance)
- Super Speciality Hospital RIMS at Adilabad (at 15 km distance)
- □ Vaccinations at Mandal-level, DT at school (upto 14 yrs)
- The KCR Kit scheme was announced by the state government in its 2017-18 budget for pregnant women and new born baby. Under this scheme, pregnant women will be provided with financial assistance of Rs. 12,000 in three phases. In case of a baby girl, an additional Rs. 1000 will be given by the government. KCR Kit contains Baby oil, Soaps useful for mother and child, Mosquito net, Dresses, Handbag, Toys for child, Diapers, Powder, Shampoo, Sarees, Towel and Napkins, Baby bed. Beneficiaries: 820



MGNREGS

- Nrega Job Card is a key document that records workers' entitlements under the scheme. It empowers the registered households to apply for work. The Job Card tells the complete details of the individuals who are registered with the local gram panchayat under the scheme. It also acts as an identity card of the individual as it contains details of the NREGA-registered individuals (such as name, NREGA registration number, details of applicants in the household, etc.) and also serves as documentary proof of the worker's entitlements.
- A wage seeker and his family members can register under this scheme by submitting an application at the Gram Panchayat. A register maintained at the gram panchayat will be sent to the Mandal Computer Centre (MCC) for entry of the wage seeking household information. The MCC allocates a Jobcard ID that is an 18-digit identification number consisting of 14-digit habitation code (District, Assembly, Mandal, Gram Panchayat, Village and Habitation) and a 4-digit household running serial number. A Job card shall be generated for each household and handed over to the Gram Panchayat.

TKHH- TELENGANA KU HARITHA HARAM

- □ A flagship programme of the Telangana Government
- □ Envisages to increase the present 24% tree cover in the State to 33% of the total geographical area envisaged by National Forest Policy of India
- ☐ The thrust areas to achieve the above are initiatives in notified forest areas & initiatives in areas outside the notified forest areas.
- The first objective is sought to be achieved by a multi-pronged approach of rejuvenating degraded forests, ensuring more effective protection of forests against smuggling, encroachment, fire, grazing and intensive soil and moisture conservation measures following the watershed approach.
- Major fillip is sought to be given to Social Forestry for achieving the second objective











PPV- PALLE PRAKRUTI VANAM

- Rural Nature Parks
- □ To provide the green environment and village parks in rural areas
- Land is cleared of garbage and pits are dug for planting **2000** saplings using man power under NREGS
- More focus on Ayurvedic saplings in near future
- ■Village parks would act as a lung space and would be developed into recreation spot for children and adults in the village
- Drawback: Situated far off from residential area, usually at the outskirts of the village, atleast 2 km away





MISSION BHAGIRATHA

- □ Tap to each Household
- ☐ To ensure safe and sustainable PIPED drinking water supply at:
- 100 LPCD (litres per capita per day) for rural areas
- 10% of water in all Irrigation sources reserved for Drinking Water.
- □3 water tanks in Seetagondi



AASARA PENSIONS

- □A pension scheme by the Government of Telangana
- Ensure secured life with dignity for all the poor
- Protect the most vulnerable sections of society in particular the old and infirm, people with HIV-AIDS, widows, incapacitated weavers and toddy tappers, who have lost their means of livelihood with growing age, in order to support their day to day minimum needs required to lead a life of dignity and social security; also elephantiasis patients, physically disabled and beedi workers.

FAIR PRICE SHOP

- ■White Card: 324
- Antyodaya Card: 06
- Annapurna Card: Nil

- ■Total: 330
- This ration card is given to those families whose total annual income is more than the poverty line limit. In rural areas, this card is issued to a family earning more than Rs 6400 per annum
- ☐ Those families having an annual income of over Rs. 1 lakh are given white cards
- Persons who do not have stable income are issued Antyodaya card. Unemployed people, women and old aged people fall under this category. These cardholders are eligible to receive 35kg of food grains per month per family. They receive foodgrains at the subsidised price of Rs.3 for rice, Rs.2 for wheat and Rs.1 for coarse grains.
- Annapoorna Yojana cards are given to older people who are poor and above 65 years & receive 10 kgs of foodgrains per month.



KALYANA LAKSHMI

- ■No. of beneficiaries: **75**
- Around 20+ beneficiaries each in SC/ST/BC communities
- □ Kalyana Lakshmi Scheme and Shaadi Mubarak is a welfare scheme for providing financial assistance for marriages by the Government of Telangana, a novel scheme for all poor people in the state
- □ The amount will be credited to the account of the bride before 15 days of marriage. (Rs.1 lakh from 2018 onwards)
- ☐The bride must have attained at least 18 years of age in order to get the benefit of this scheme
- ☐ This scheme can prevent early marriages and increase the literacy rate among girls
