Agriculture – Govt support, Marketing, Mechanisation

- ✓ **Rythu Bandhu:** Direct benefit of 10000 per acre per year
- ✓ **PM Krishi Sinchayee Yojana:** Subsidy upto 75000 for adopting micro irrigation practices.



Threshers used on hire to harvest crops

- ✓ Cotton procured through Cotton corporation of India.
- ✓ Other crops procured through state agencies and guaranteed prices.



Agriculture - SUPPORT SCHEMES

Extension:

- One extension officer per 5000 acre. Duties include encouraging farmers to adopt better varieties of seeds popularise government programs.

Credit:

- Agricultural credit disbursed through four primary agricultural credit societies . 100 % credit coverage and repayment observed.

Landless labourers:

- Male labourers paid 400 per day. Female 200 per day. During lean seasons they work as construction workers or ginning mills in nearby areas




Gram Panchayat structure




Financial/Digital literacy campaign (E-Sewa Kendra)
