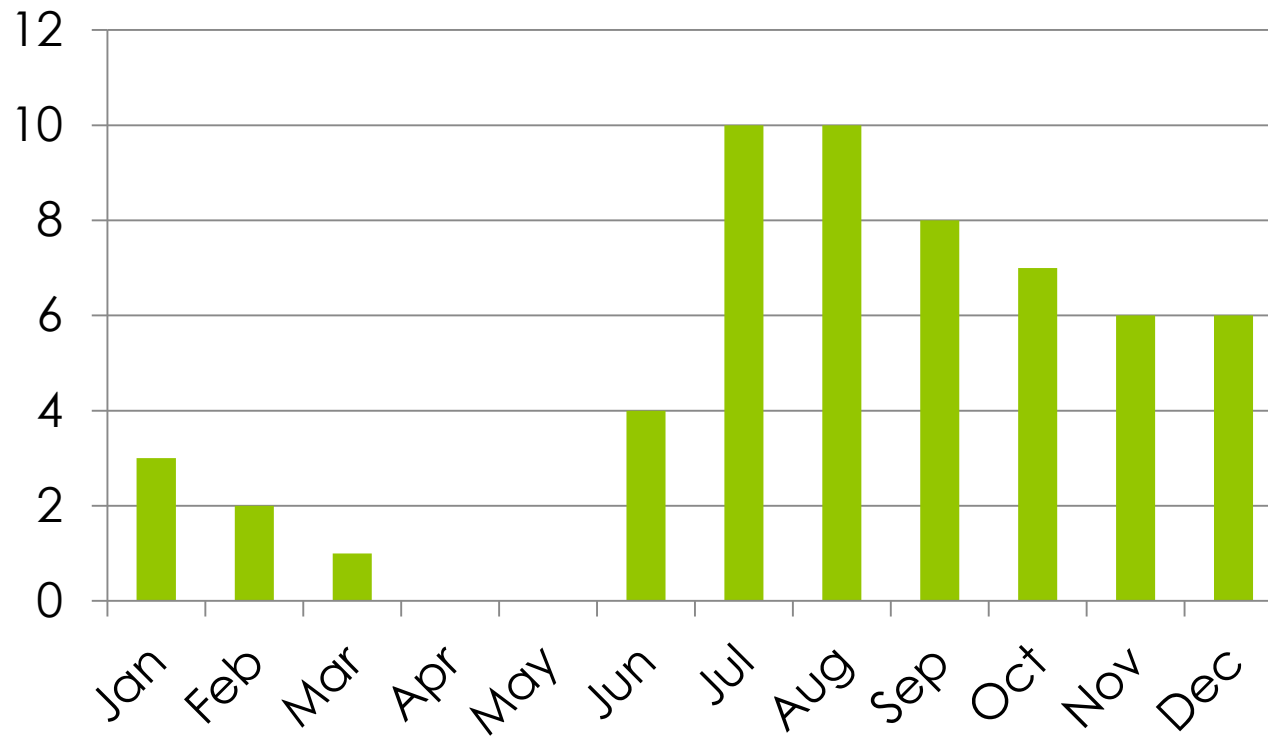

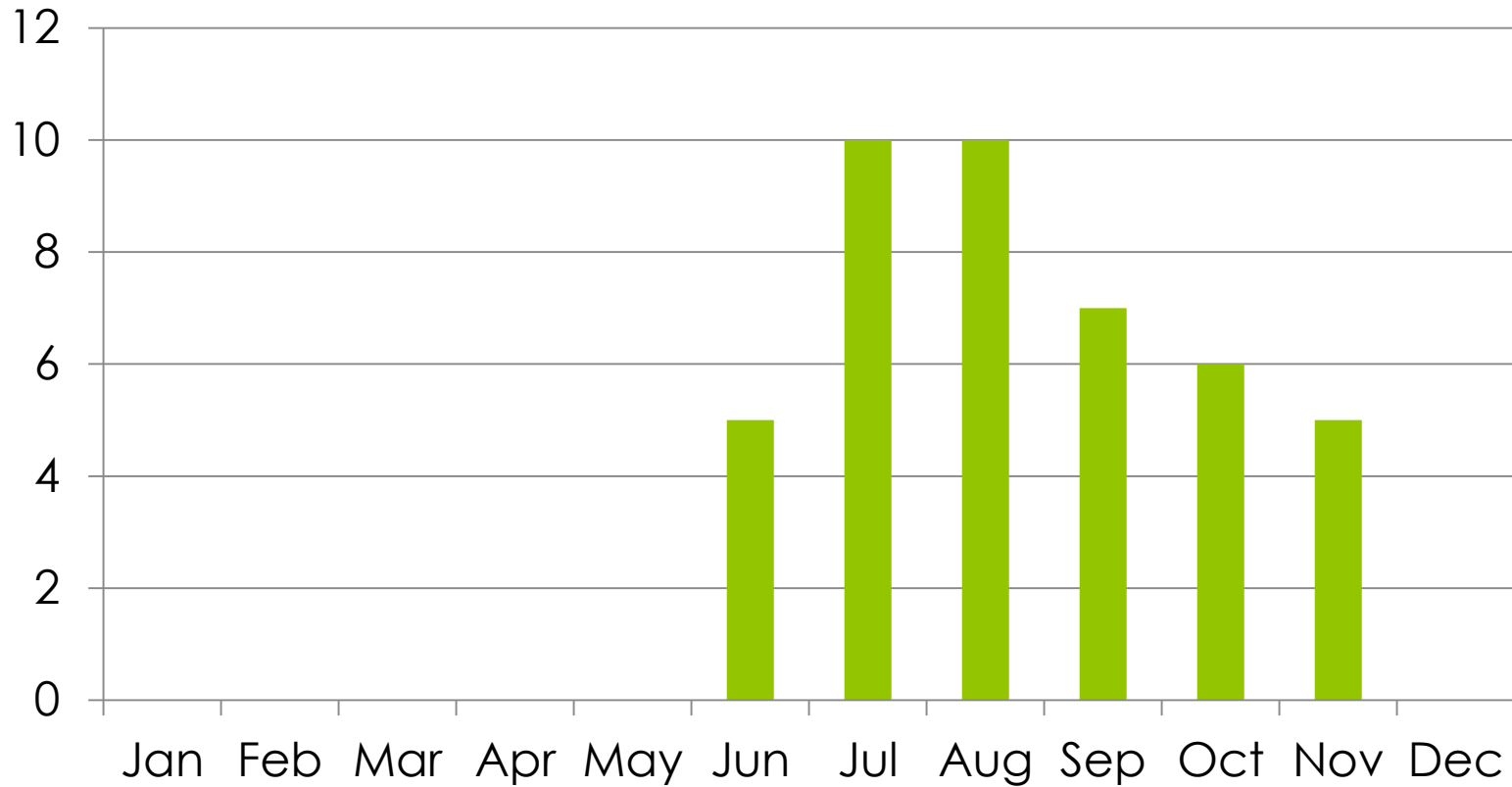

Relative availability of water



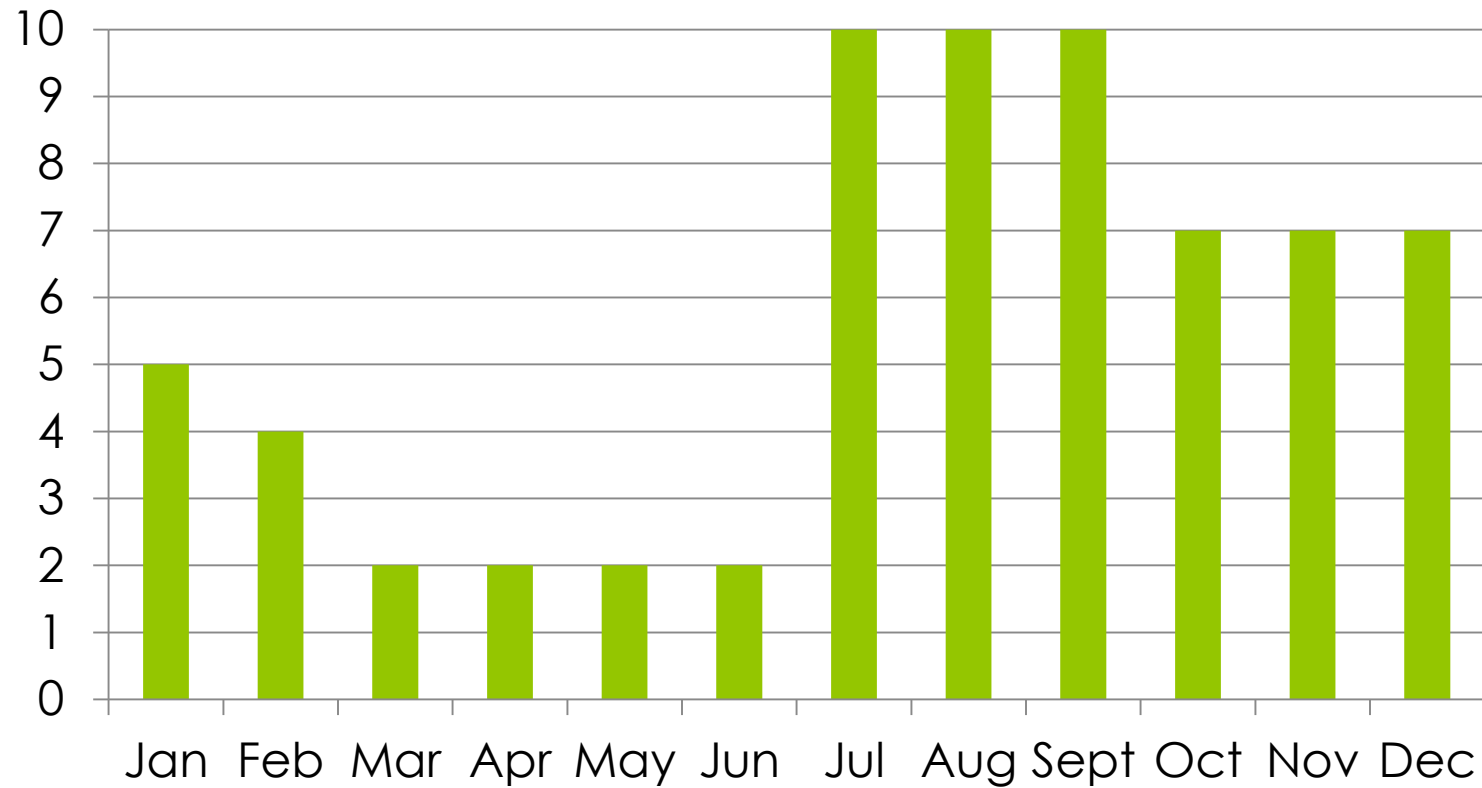
SEASONALITY

Relative monthly rainfall



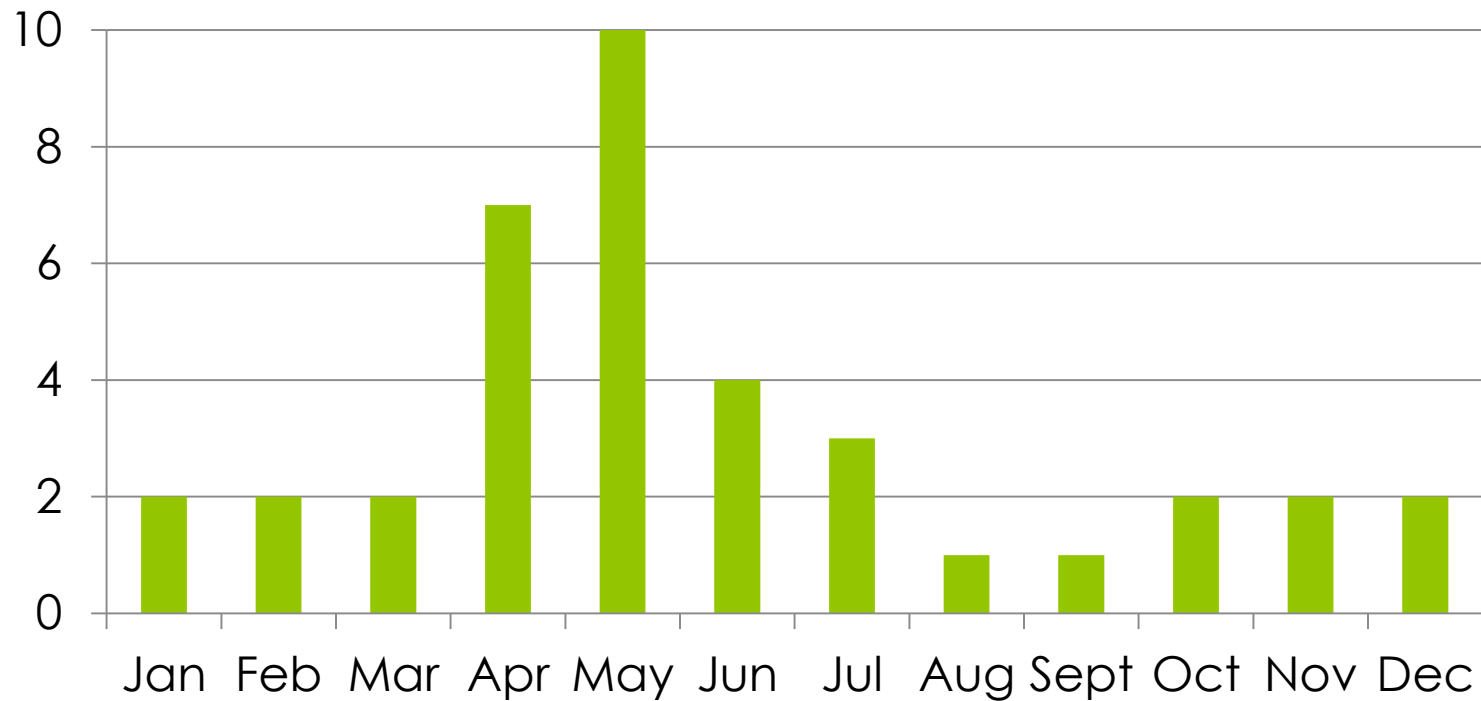

Issues and concerns

- Drainage problem
- Damaged and left over houses
- Some part of the village doesn't have concrete roads and electricity.
- Wastage and theft of electricity.
- Open defecation is prevalent.
- Lack of awareness about post office facilities and hence to the banking facilities.

Primary school and Anganwadi

- Total enrolment: 109 (53-boys; 56-girls)
- Teachers: 05 (2- ST; 3-BC)
- Mid day meal provided
- School grant(Rs 5000); Maintenance grant(Rs 10000) received on time
- Issues and concerns:
 - No electricity due to non payment of bills
 - Lack of supervision affecting quality of education
 - 3 Anganwadis.

EDUCATION



High School

- Telugu Medium
- Total enrolment: 209 (114- boys; 90- girls)
- Teachers: 09 (All Male); travel from Achampet daily
- Mid day meal provided
- 10th class result: 70% in 2014-15
- Award meritorious students annually through scholarships constituted by villagers.
- Separate toilets available for girls and boys
- Computer lab available; but no instructor

EDUCATION



Issues and Concerns

- No proper sitting arrangement in classes
- Seasonal absenteeism for boys
- No hostel facility and playground
- High drop out rate for girls
- No vocational training
- Need more state bus facility for students coming from distance.
- Lack of Discipline and supervision
- Parents are taking loan to send their children to private schools

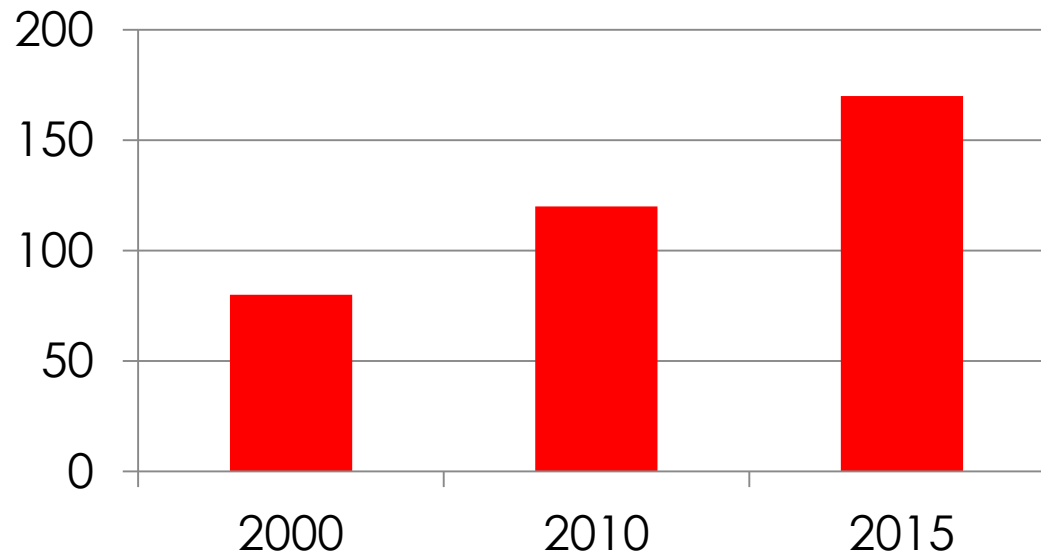
Overview

- Rainshadow area: 908 mm rain annually
- Water stressed
- Last three years have been drought years: average 400 mm rainfall
- Groundwater based agrarian economy
- Close to 200 borewells in the village
- 3 major overhead storage tanks: 60 KI, 40 KI, 40 KI
- Chandrasagar Canal

Groundwater

- Extraction is increasing, recharge has only begun
- Main source of water for all activities of the village
- Seasonality and water: maximum stress right before monsoon

Approximate borewell depth in feet

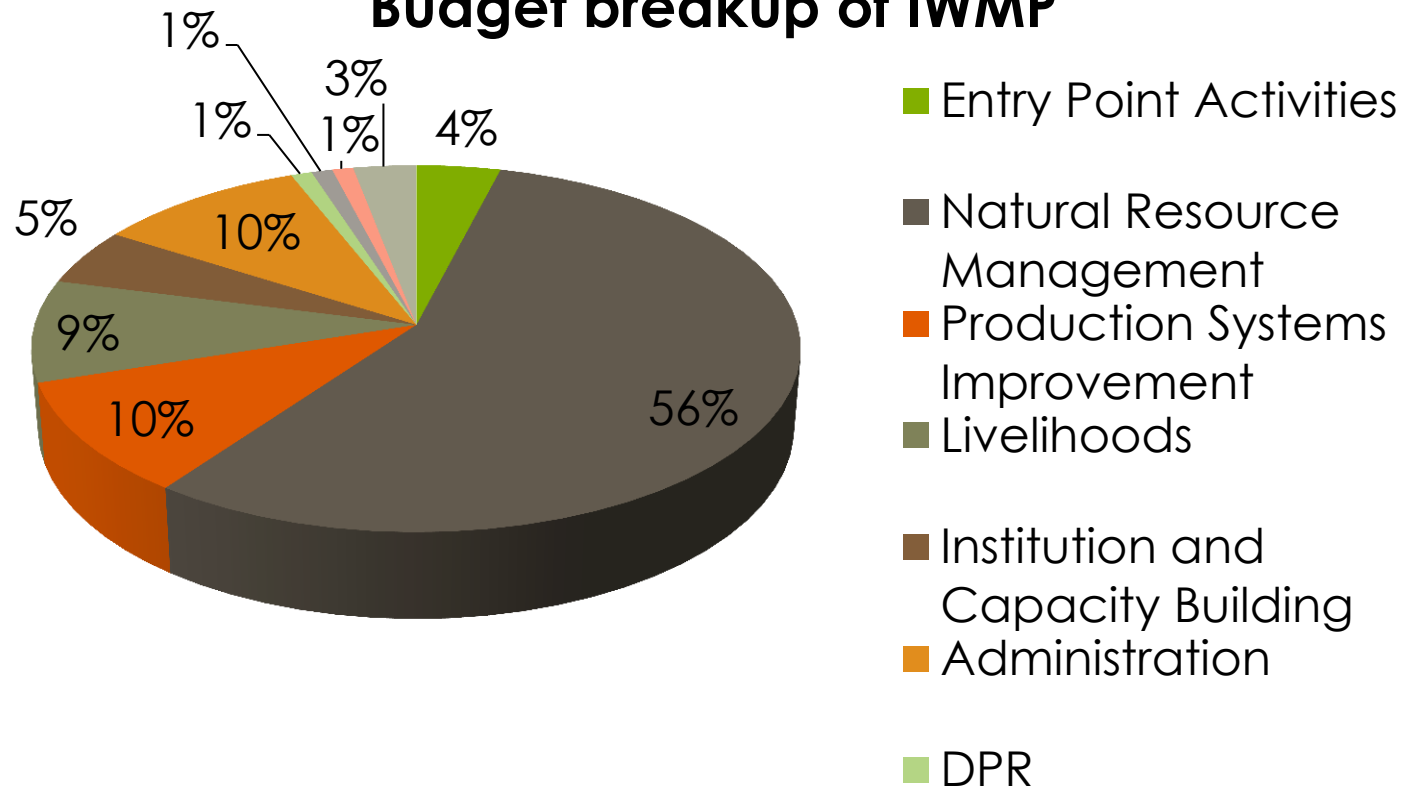


IWMP (now part of PMKSY)

- 1422 hectares of the village under IWMP
- IWMP budget - 12000 Rs./ hectare
- Activities undertaken: check dams, percolation tanks, cattle troughs (under NRM)
- 14 Solar streetlights (under EPA)
- Drinking Water Purification Plant: planned but lapsed.
(issue of 10% contribution by villagers)

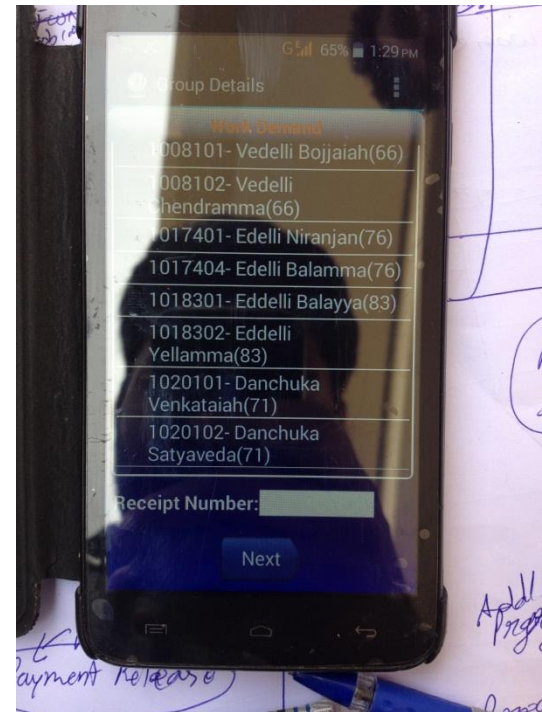
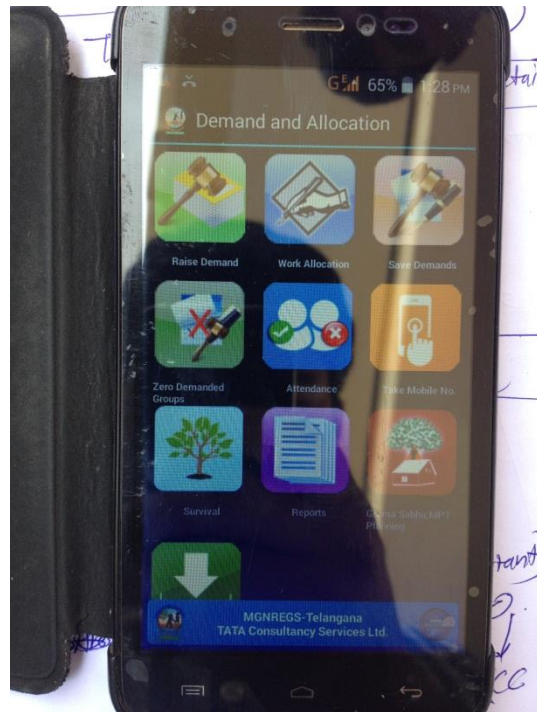

- FA forwards it to Technical Assistant
- TA forwards it to Computer Operator (for Estimates)
- Receipt
- Receipt goes to Project Director District
- Sanction
- Work Start

Payment:

- Pit is Ready ----- Rs.3000
- Generate Muster
- Rs. 3000 deposited in Bank Account
- When it is complete, FA will visit
- Then TA → EC → APO → Makes final Payment

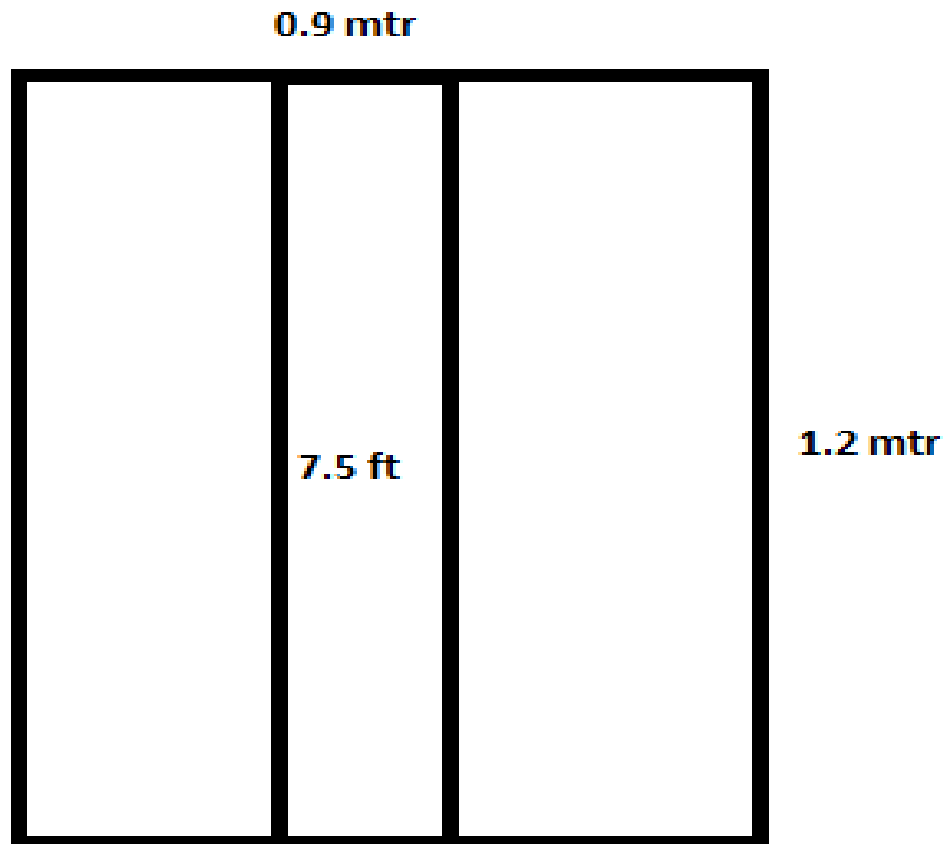

- Cutting short the route
- Very little work is done, only 31 latirnes
- Banks are far off.

Sub-Centre

- Caters to 4 hamlets
- 2 ANMs, 1 ASHA and 1 Supervisor nurse
- No male health assistant
- Timings : 09:00-16:00 hours, Sunday closed, ASHA 24*7
- Clinic: Monday ANC, Wednesday & Saturday UIP
- Vaccines: BCG, OPV, DPT, HepB, HiB, Measles, JE
- First aid kits, malaria diagnostic kits
- No orthopedic, no ambulance, no institutional delivery: referral to Achampet civil hospital
- No private RMP I village

PHC, Siddapur

- 20 km from Inole Sub-Centre
- AYUSH clinic
- Health schemes: JSY, JSSK (Janani Shishu Samrakshan Karyakram), NRHM
- 2MO, 1 CHO, 1 public health nurse, 1 senior assistant female, 1 pharmacist, 23 ANMs, 1 Lab technician, 6 HAs, 69 ASHAs
- Labour room, only normal deliveries, LSCS referral to Achampet
- ART, DOTS provided
- No ophthalmologist, obs/gyne, orthopedic
- Lab: RBS, CBP, urine, sputum, malaria smear (Pf, Pv)
- One Veterinary Hospital: one doctor, assistant post vacant, primary services and vaccines, referral to Achampet

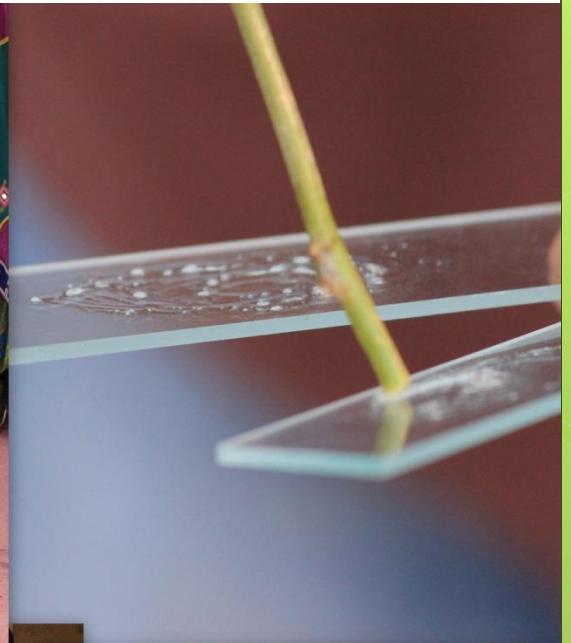

WATER

Causes

- No direct water source
- Water level going down
- Limited re-generation and conservation of water
- Awareness exist but limited steps taken

Possible solutions

- SLBC should be extended upto the village
- More check dams should be constructed
- Sensitization towards optimal use of available water.

LAND

Causes

- Land Ownership mainly to ST community
- Poor quality of soil
- Small land holdings with unequal access to farm mechanization

Possible solutions

- Identify waste land and provide to non land holders.
- Ambrabad movement
- Demand for agency area de- notification.

UNEMPLOYMENT

Causes

- Lack of opportunities (no industries)
- Lack of finance for self employment
- Government jobs only for ST community
- No technical education available

Possible solutions

- IWMP fund should be released on time to improve livelihood
- Hand holding of entrepreneurs to utilize MADA funds
- Encourage SHGs to enter into economic activities
- Skill Development and vocational training should be provided

Monkey Menace

Causes

- Near to forest
- Causing damage to crop
- Attacking old aged people and children

Possible solutions

- Trained langoor should be used to keep the monkeys away.
- Forest department should play a pro active role to solve the problem.
