

The vision of Mission Bhagiratha owes to the success of Siddipet comprehensive drinking water sceheme (Tap to each household)


Objective: To ensure safe and sustainable PIPED drinking water supply to each and every household

- Nearest PHC in Kusumanchi Mandal(13 kms away)

Facilities available

- 102 Ambulance service with 15-20 minutes response time
- MBBS doctor available in PHC with facilities for pregnant women
- Door-to-door testing facilities for BP and Diabetic patients

ACREDITED SOCIAL HEALTH ACTIVIST(ASHA)/HEALTH

COVID relief works

- Distribution of Corona kits containing medicines to households
- 2nd COVID vaccination dose of village completed

Other activities

- Every child in village covered under immunization programme(105, 50-Boys, 55-girls)
- Registration of pregnant women and ensuring benefits of govt schemes
- Organizing health camps and awareness camps periodically
- No infant deaths in the previous year.



Recommendations/Action points

- Health sub-centre is an important requirement for the village to serve the high population.
- A High school in the village or a nearby village for the easy access of children to education after Class 7^{th.}
- SHGs in the village need to be strengthened to start new small scale industries thereby making women more independent and empowered.
- •The farmers need to shift from the conventional crops like paddy, chilli to cash crops like vegetables, flowers as water availability is there.
