

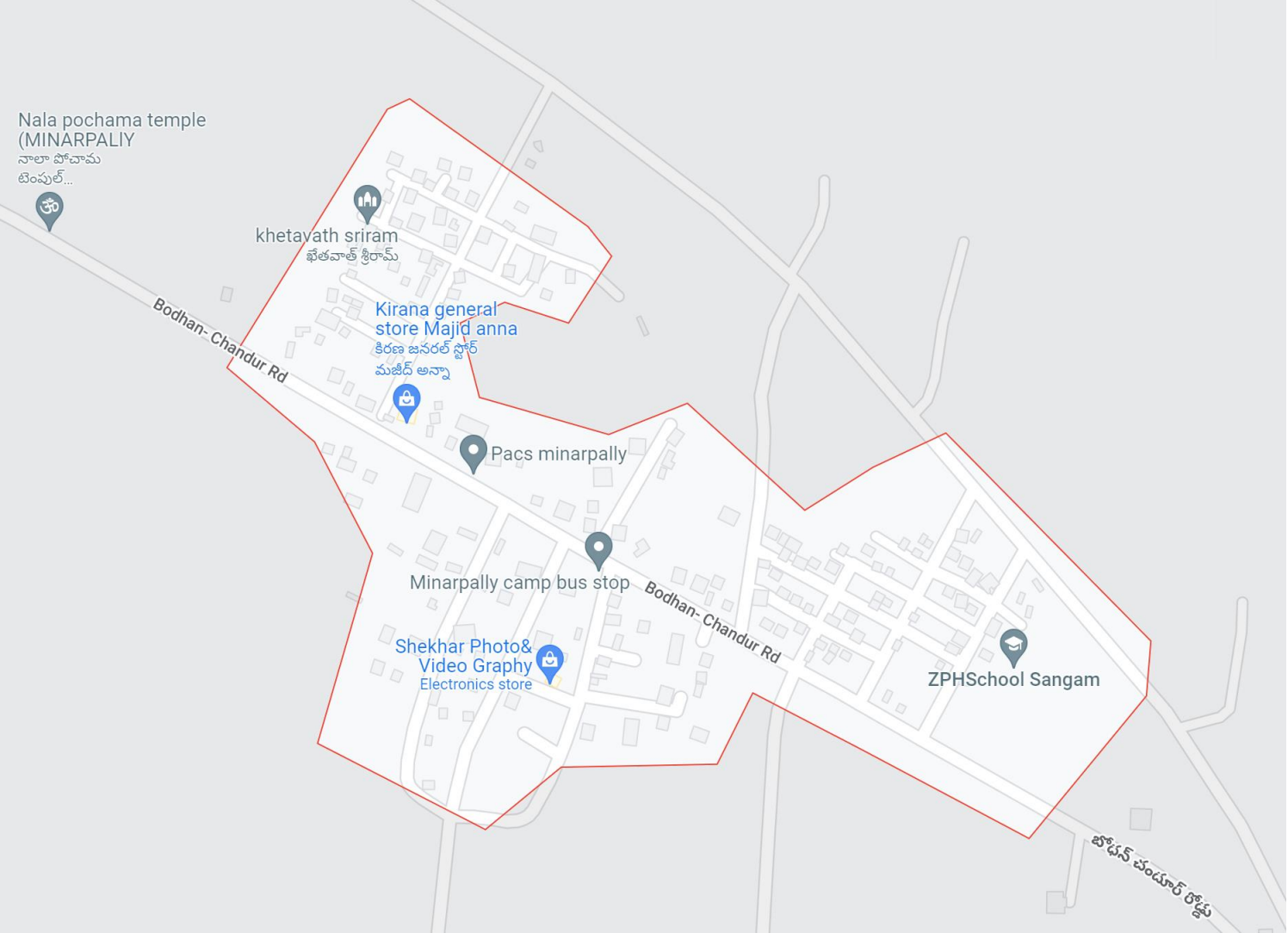

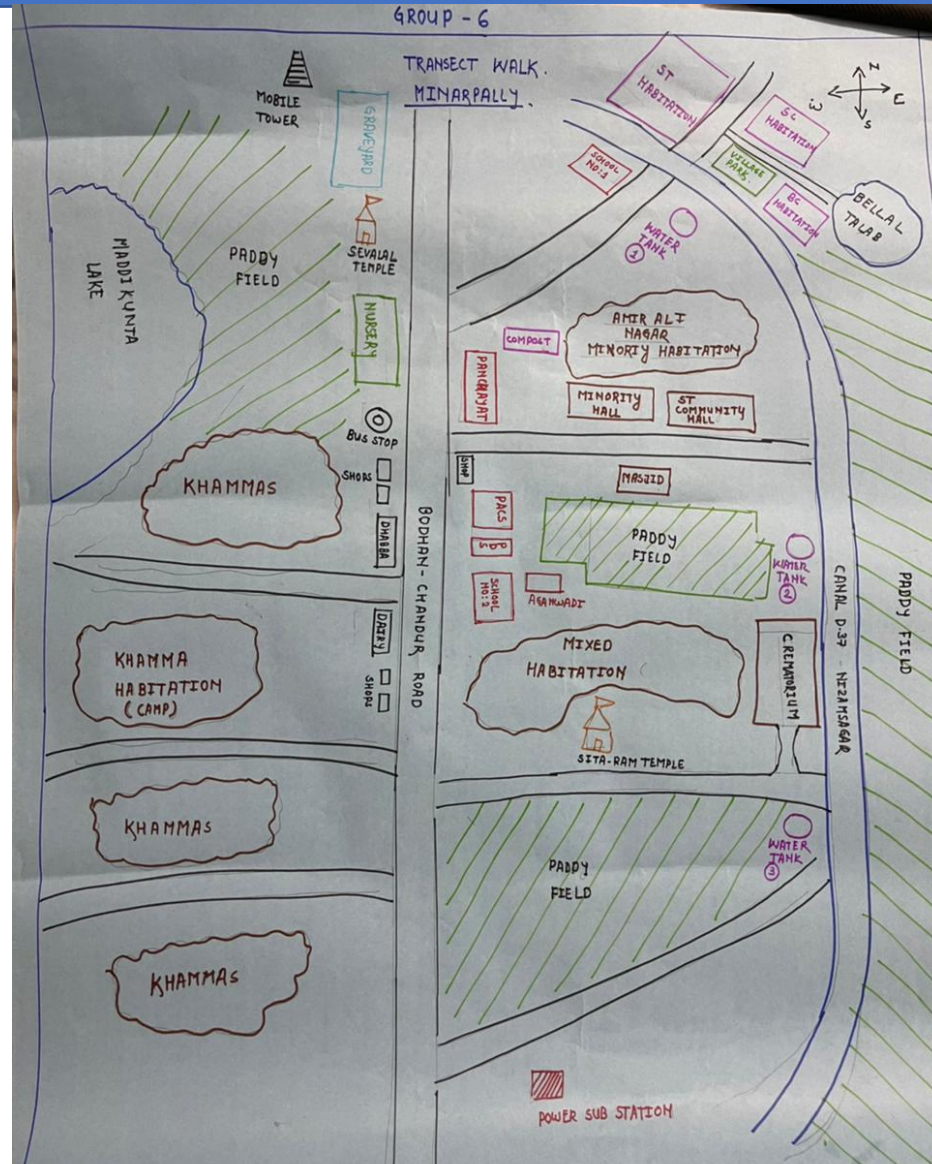

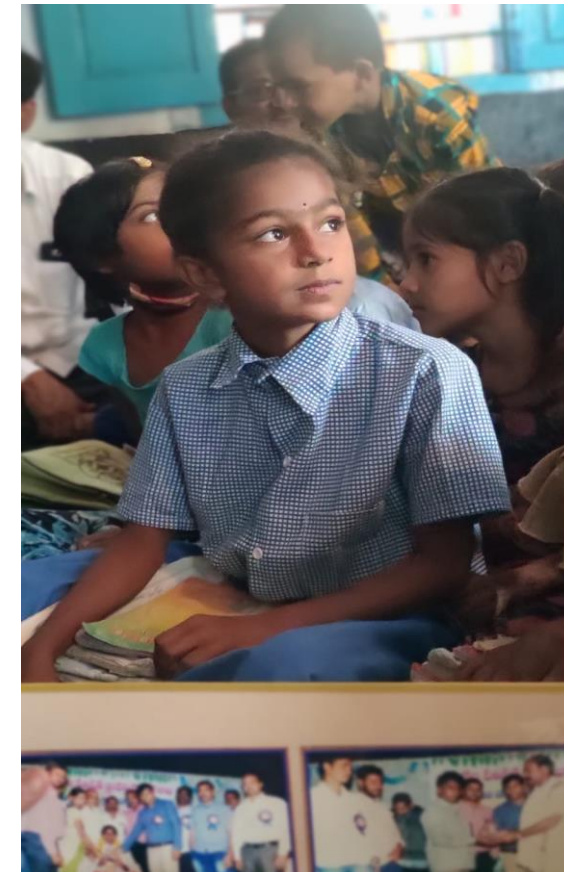

SUGGESTIONS FOR FURTHER DEVELOPMENT OF MINARPALLE VILLAGE

- **School**
 - ✓ need to procure at least 1 more fan per room of both schools so that students don't spend time in hot conditions
 - ✓ Need to provide desks for students so that they can study in a dignified manner. IF desks are not possible, then at least mats can be provided.
- **Housing**- the minorities can be given pucca houses under 2 BHK scheme & PAY. If that is not provided, at least 1 room with concrete ceiling is must for them, as this is in consonance with their fundamental right of "right to life".
 - ✓ around 60 Households have not received funds under this scheme and are living in kutcha houses.
- **Extra funds for capital infrastructure development** in village- The village has received prize for the "Best panchayat" and "Model Village" for its cleanliness & sanitation. They were entitled to cash prize of Rs 6 lakhs for both. However, they have not received the amount. Hence quick disbursal of their prize money (6 lakhs) can solve their problem of fund requirement.

SUGGESTIONS FOR FURTHER DEVELOPMENT OF MINARPALLE VILLAGE

- Need to construct a separate **Health Sub-center** for the village as ANM & ASHA workers are presently without any room for them and sitting temporarily in Gram panchayat.
- General suggestion for improving effectiveness of **MGNREGS**
 - **Special collector fund** for village development. with this fund they aspired to do works like- side drain; CC road; SC graveyard; school infrastructure; compound wall for crematorium and Gram panchayat et.al.
 - district administration needs to diversify the number of works done under this act.
 - **Consistent/Timely and adequate disbursal of maintenance funds** for already done MGNREGS works. for e.g., watering requirements for plantation require around Rs 30,000 per month, but they have not received any amount in the last 1 year.
